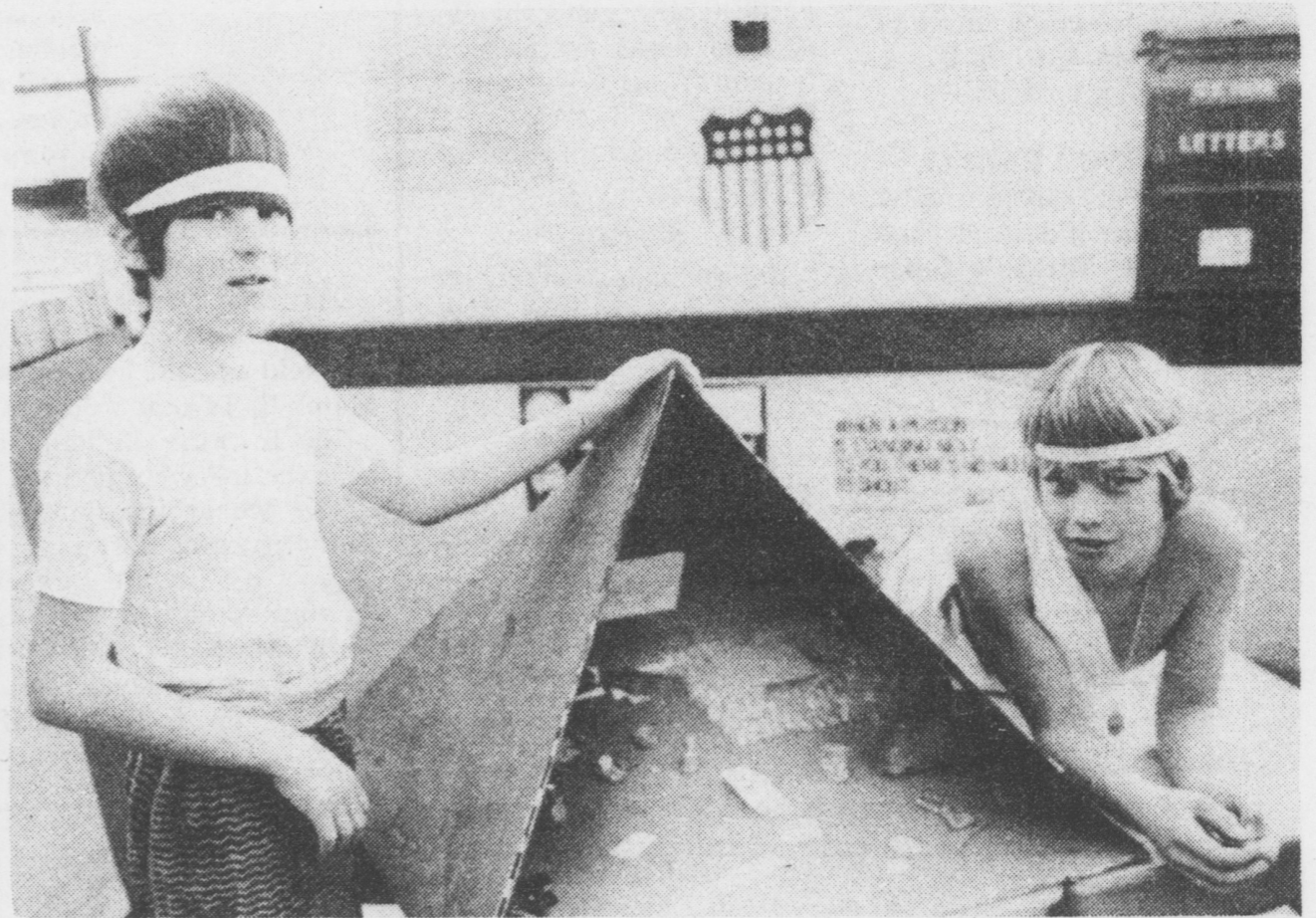

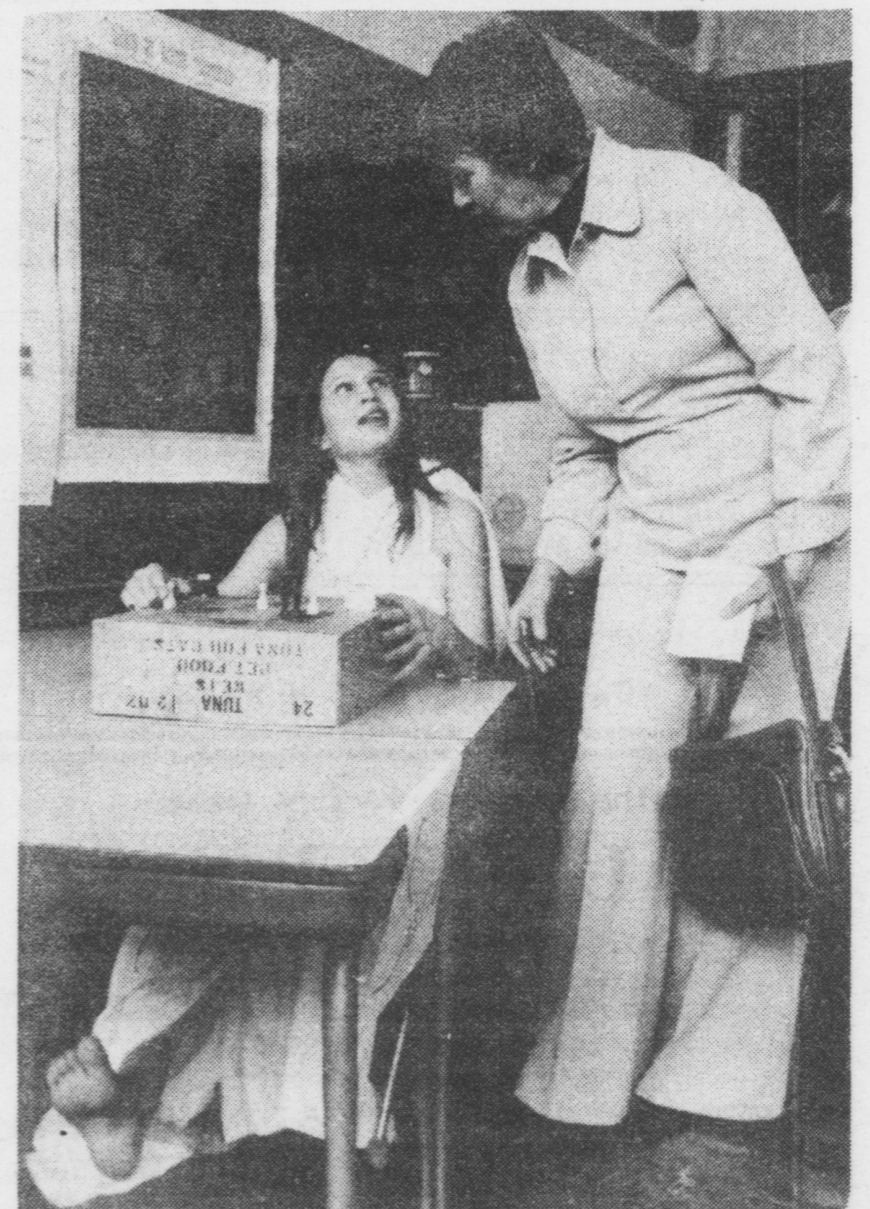
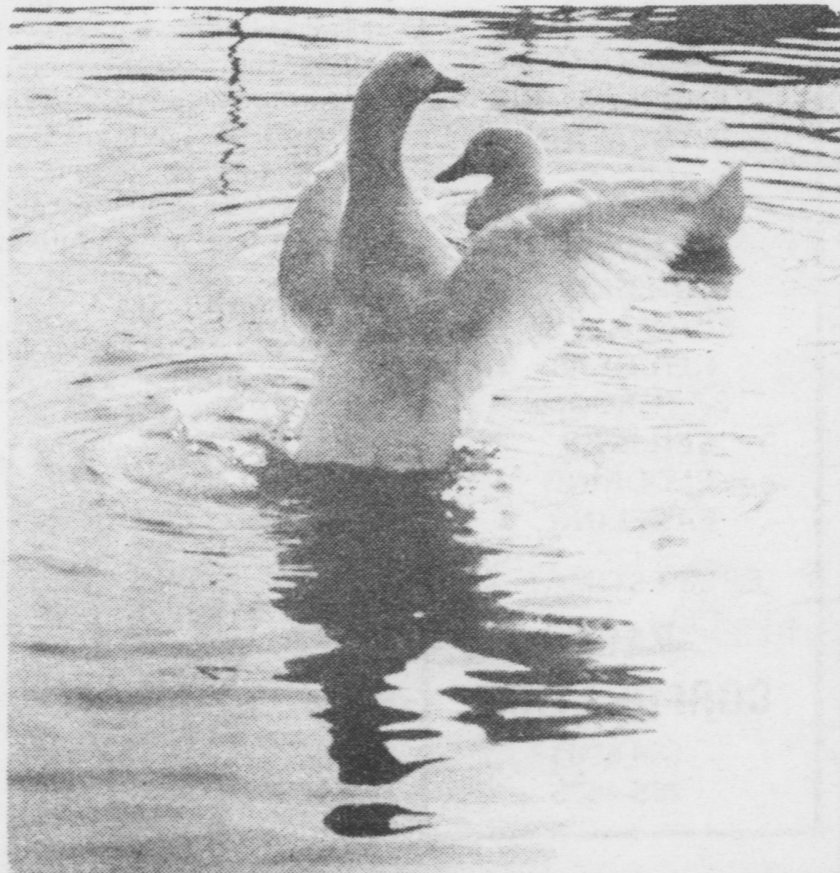
Ed Hess (left) and Tom White (right) explained the contents of a model pyramid to interested students.
