and Bolivia to provide a safe and accessible water supply and a source of protein. Contributions are being made for legal defense and family assistance for political prisoners under repressive regimes; for political refugees from Latin America; and to projects helping women make their full contribution in their communities and nations whereby training is provided which will help them earn a living. In addition, gifts are made annually for Christian women's colleges, ministries among migrant workers, for literature for women and children overseas in areas of faith, family life, nutrition, development; for a Christian ministry in our national parks; and for scholarships for women, and leadership training.

Women from the following churches will be joining in the service for the Mount Joy Community: Trinity Lutheran, Mount Joy Mennonite, St. Mary's Catholic, Florin Church of the Brethren, St. Luke's Episcopal, Crossroads Brethren in Christ, Presbyterian, Church of God, and Chiques, Glossbrenner, and St. Mark's United Methodist Churches.

A purse of money was presented to Rev. Father Joseph G. Gotwalt, at a special farewell observance Sunday. The gift, from members of the congregation, marked the retirement of Father Gotwalt from Presentation BVM Church,

**Father Joseph Gotwalt retires**

Marietta, which became effective on March 1, 1976.

Father Gotwalt was a member of sacred music and liturgy committees. He was a member of the organization for the priest choir for 24 years, and Diocesan director of the St. Vincent de Paul Society from 1963 to 1972.

Having been ordained in St. Patrick Cathedral, Harrisburg, by Bishop Philip McDevitt in 1932, Father Gotwalt was first assigned to Our Lady of Mount Carmel as assistant pastor. Later the same year he was transferred to Sacred Heart Parish, Lancaster. He returned to Mount Carmel in 1940 where he received his

first pastorate, Immaculate Conception, Fairfield, in 1943. He was also administrator of the mission at Blue Ridge Summit.

After going to St. Ignatius, Orrtanna, in 1946 and to St. Vincent, Hanover, from 1947 to 1961, Father Gotwalt transferred to St. James, Steelton. In 1964, Father Gotwalt was assigned to St. Patrick Church in Trevorton. He came to Marietta in 1967.

Rev. Father Michael S. Kobularik, former assistant Pastor at St. Vincent Church, Hanover, will assume the duties of Pastor of Presentation BVM Church in Marietta.

**5 more ways to Save on your phone bill (Part 2)**



**6.** Are you going to be away from your home for an extended period of time? Based on how long you will be away, our business office representative can determine if you can save money by temporarily suspending your phone service.

**7.** Did you just get a wrong number when you dialed a long distance number? Don't hang up and grumble about it. Ask the answering party the area code and the number you reached in error. Then call the operator and tell her what happened. The operator will remove the charges.

**8.** Did you get cut off from your party in the middle of your conversation? Did you have a noisy connection? Don't just hang up and call back. The calling party should call the operator and report the problem. The operator will credit you for the time your call was interrupted.

**9.** Did you get charged for a long distance call you never made? Call your United Telephone business office and our representative will have the charge removed.

**10.** Dial your own long distance numbers direct. That's the cheapest way. Of course, you may not reach the person you wanted on the first call, but you could probably make two or three station-to-station calls for the price of one person-to-person call.
