Medical center adjusts leases

At a special meeting on February 18, 1976, the board of directors of the Northwest Lancaster County Medical Association approved the signing of a new lease with the physicians occupying the Family Health Center. Under the terms of the renegotiated lease the increased monthly rental to be paid by the physicians will be substantially equal to the Association's monthly mortgage payment, including interest, plus the cost of real estate

taxes, insurance and maintenance for the facility.

In a prepared statement R. Clair Weaver, M.D., representing Norlanco Medical Associates, delivered an annual report to the Association's Board of Directors. Dr. Weaver commended the members of the Association's board for their efforts in getting the Family Health Center started and for their interest and encouragement in recruiting the physicians who staff the center.

Dr. Weaver reported on new and increased services such as counseling and health screening, the addition of pulmonary function equipment and the addition of three new physicians during 1975. It was also reported that during 1975 39,754 patients passed through the Family Health Center.

In an unrelated matter the Association's board reported that plaques honoring contributors to the Association's initial fund raising drive have been ordered and will be affixed to the facility in their appropriate places as soon as they are received.
