Indians lose to Camp Hill cagers

A 68-70 loss to Camp Hill eliminated the Donegal basketball team from the District 3 AA playoffs last Mon. at Shippensburg.

Excellent shooting led the Indians to a 42-34 halftime lead. The Indians cooled off in the second half, and Camp Hill caught up.

Bob Barto, Donegal's key defensive player, was kept out of most of the action by an injured ankle.

In spite of Barto's injury and a dismal 30 percent shooting record in the 2d half, the Indians stayed close to victory every second of the game.

Trailing 68-61 with 35 seconds remaining in the game, Donegal staged a rally that almost saved the contest. Mark McKercher scored 5 points in 15

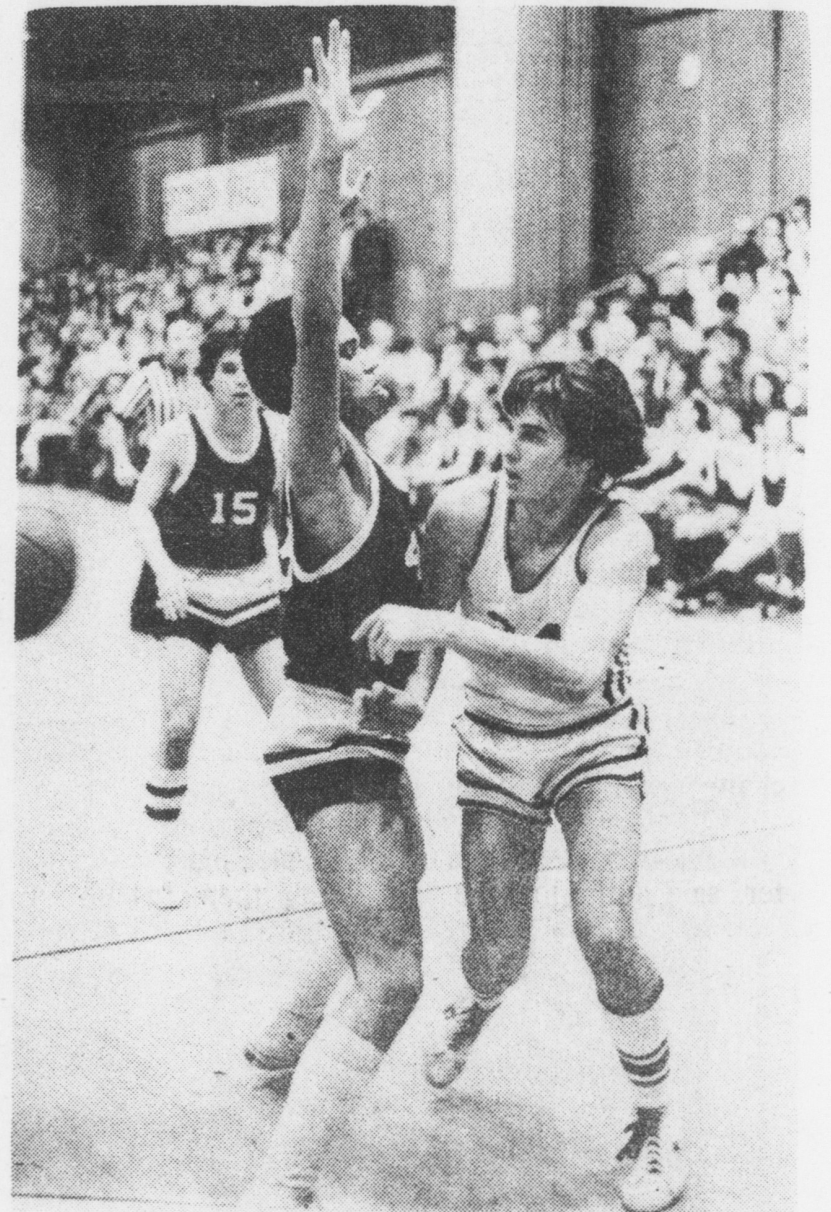

Howell and Garner are wrestling champs

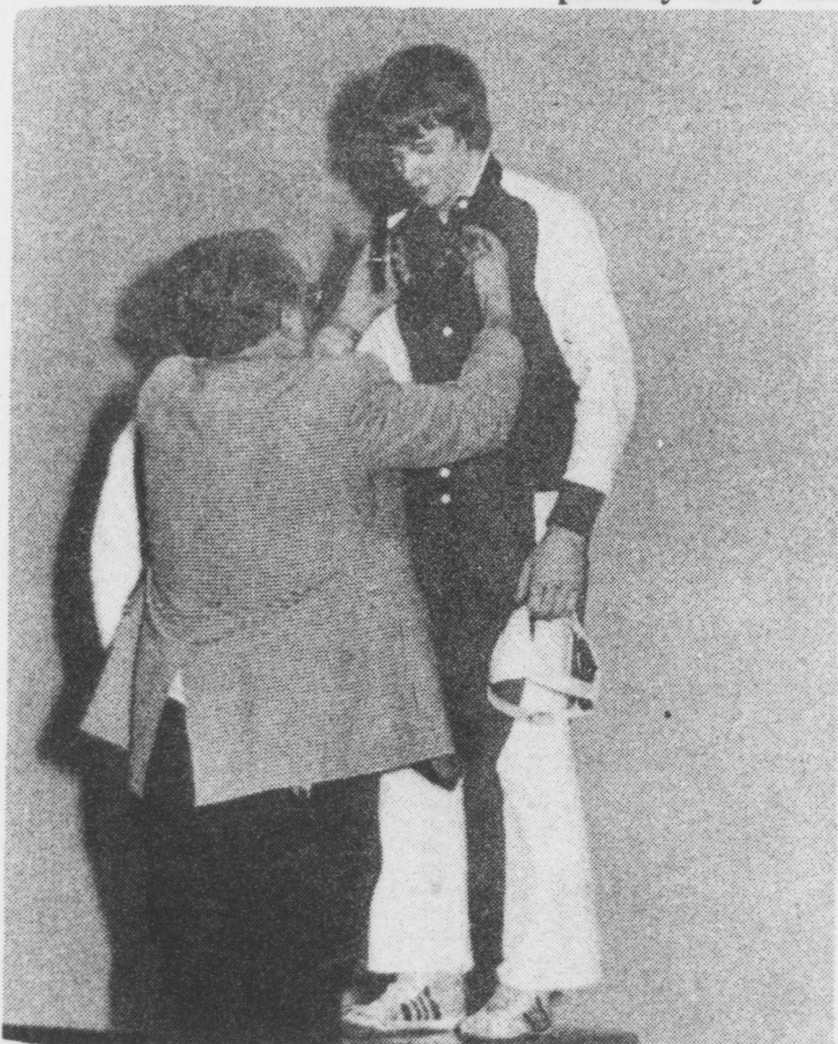
