IMMUNIZATION LAW - As of October 1974 Act 67 requires the following immunizations by all new

enrollees prior to entry into school for the first time: 3 or more doses of Diptheria toxoid; 3 or more doses of Tetanus toxoid; 3 or more doses of Trivalent Oral Polio Vaccine; 1 Measles vaccine or medically confirmed disease; 1 Rubella vaccine.

Parents wishing to enroll a child in first grade who has had no previous kindergarten experience should contact Gene Newcomer at Riverview School or Seiler School.

Additional information concerning kindergarten will be available at the registration centers.

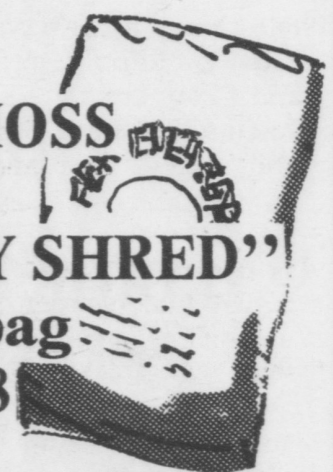
