Rev. Don Blosser, pastor of the Akron Mennonite Church, has chosen the topic, "America-the Thirteenth Tribe," on Tuesday, April 6.

The Rev. Dr. Robert A. Raines, director of the Kirkridge Retreat and Study Center in Bangor, PA will present two addresses on Tuesday evening, one at a banquet at 5 p.m. and another at a service closing the four-day program at 7:30 p.m.
