Although deaf since she was an infant, Aunt Lizzie is an avid reader and devotes much time to studying her Bible and reading local and Ohio newspapers.

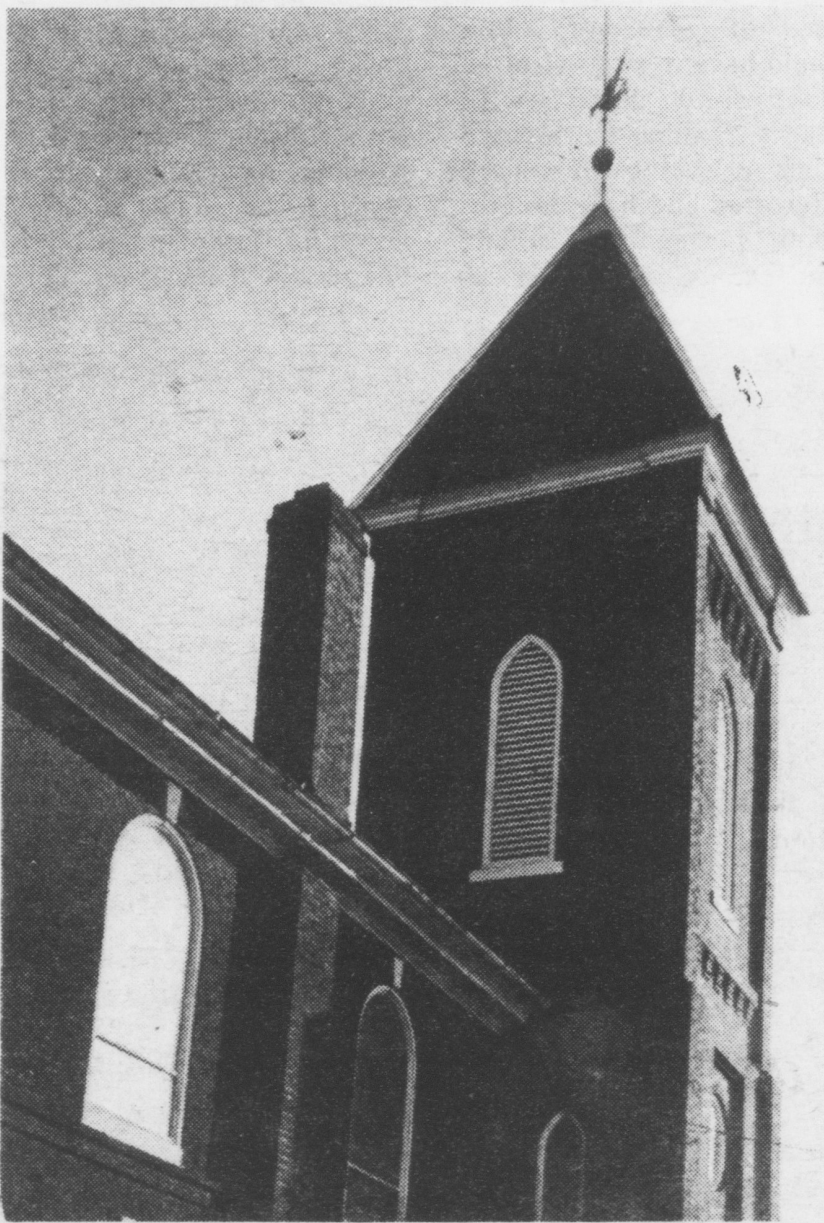
Possibly the oldest resident of Lancaster County, she once remarked, "God has a reason for giving me 100 years and I thank the Good Lord."
