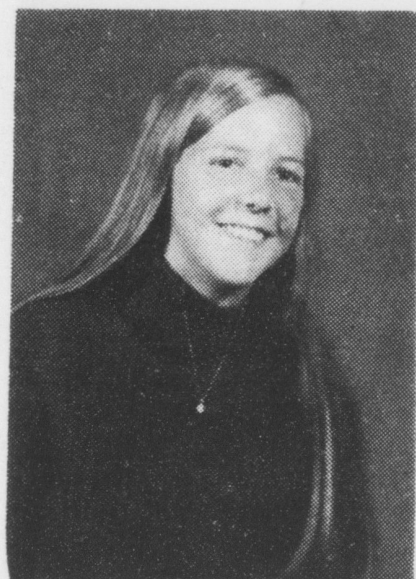
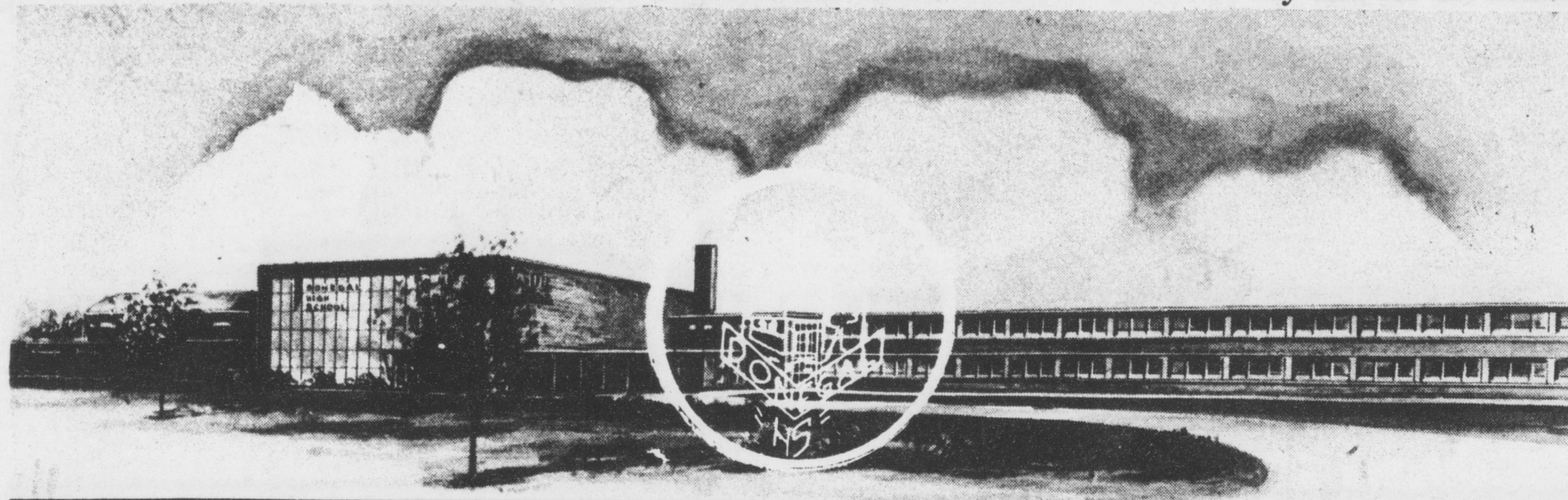

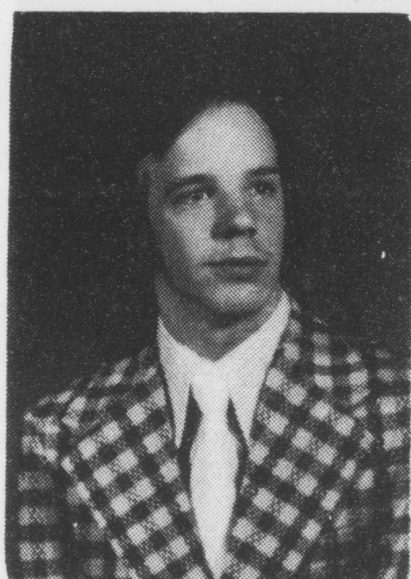

The Red Cross is known for involving youth in all its program areas. The Red Cross wants to involve young people in programs and projects. Much in our communities needs to be done and no one, young or old, should sit by and wait for someone else to move. The Red Cross is anxious to develop young leaders.

Become a part of the Summer Volunteer Program. Work with elderly or bedridden people. They value friendship. Or, if you are considering speech therapy as a possible career, work at the Cleft Palate Clinic in Lancaster. Socialization, recreation, and occupational therapy are important parts of volunteer service.

A volunteer at a hospital has an excellent opportunity to see a hospital at work. Among the responsibilities will be transportation of patients by wheelchair, running errands, talking and

visiting with patients, feeding patients, filling water pitchers and making beds.

If you have a particular skill or craft that you are familiar with, you can use your talent to encourage the guests of a nursing home to become involved in various aspects of life.

What about social services? Persons wanting to volunteer through social services can count on getting involved in arts and crafts, letter writing, playing bingo, reading and simply talking with the guests. To be a volunteer, you must be both a friend and an aid. If this interests you, contact the Lancashire Hall in Neffsville. You must be over 14 years old.

Do you like to be around little children? If so, Lancaster Day Nursery is in need of your help. You would have to supervise the playground, assist with snacks, reading stories and other such things. If you are interested and have an outgoing personality, contact the Day Care Center in

Lancaster.

If you see nursing as a career for the future, Lancaster General Hospital and Lancaster Osteopathic Hospital are looking for volunteers to help in patient transporting, entertaining, and cleaning, etc. Contact the hospital of your choice if you are interested.

The State Hospital for Crippled Children at Elizabethtown has had an extensive volunteer program for both adults and children for many years. If you are interested in working with crippled children, this program may be for you.

St. Joseph's Hospital wants volunteers for nursing service activities. Delivery service to x-ray and EKG labs as well as answering patients signal lights will be important duties.

A person interested in a career involving animals has a good opportunity to work with dogs, cats, and potential owners by volunteering to help at the Humane League Animal Shelter in Lancaster. The

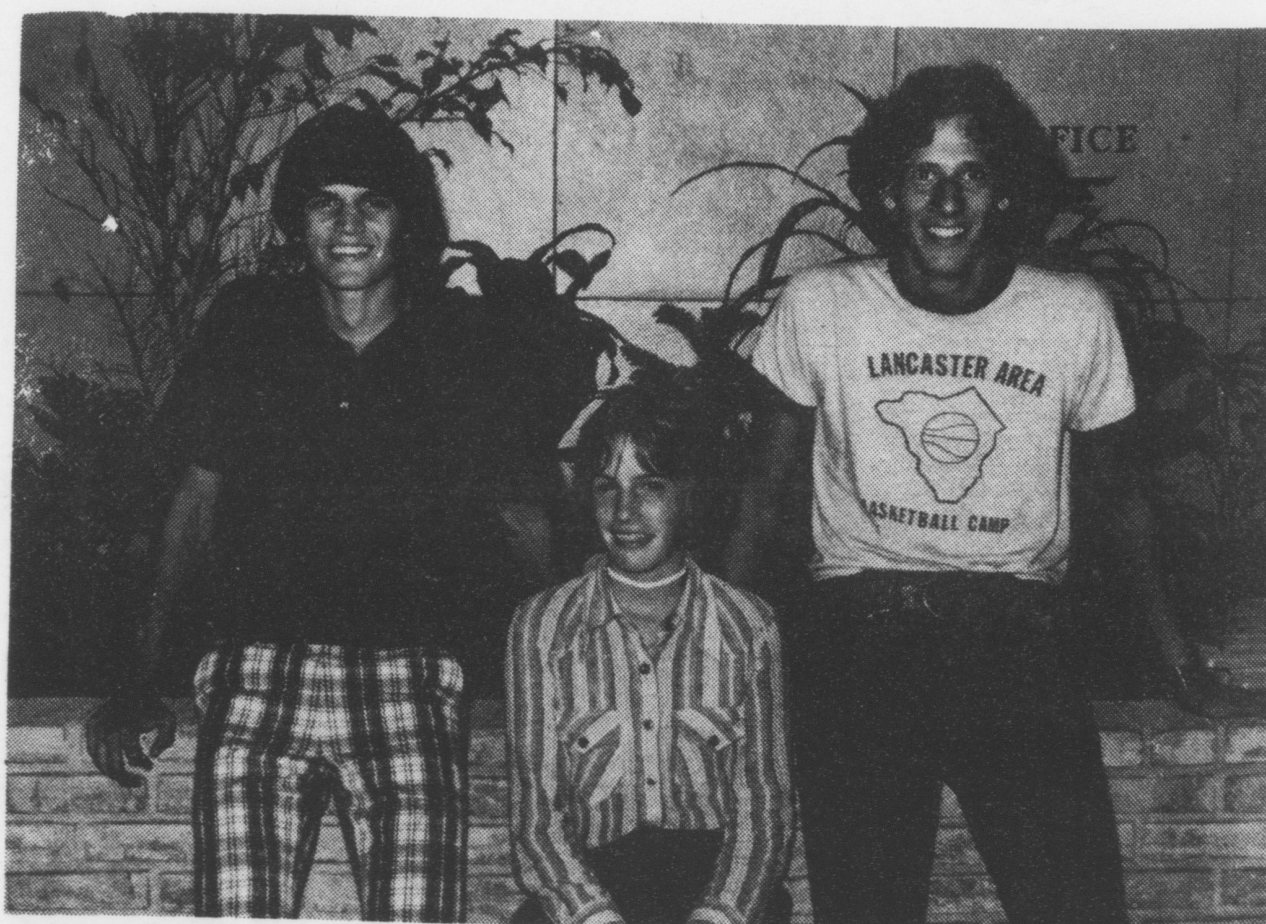
work includes feeding, watering, grooming, and helping people interested in adoption.

A volunteer in the Learn to Swim program will be helping to teach 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders how to swim. You must be able to perform certain basic swimming skills to be a volunteer for this program. The volunteer will be taught teaching techniques.

The Red Cross also offers several safety programs, including First Aid, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, Water Safety Programs, and Basic Canoeing.

Volunteer work can be a valuable experience in many ways. Some nursing schools require that applicants have a volunteer experience in a hospital or other nursing service. Most strongly suggest it.

How can you become a part of the volunteer program? Get a catalog and application from your guidance counselor or school nurse. Get involved, don't miss the chance.
