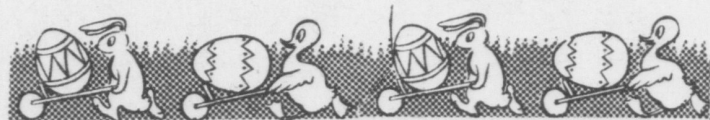

### Hunter education

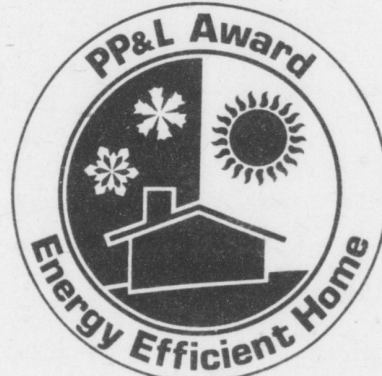
A hunter education course will be held this Saturday, April 10, at 1 p.m. at the Mount Joy Sportsman Association. The course is free.

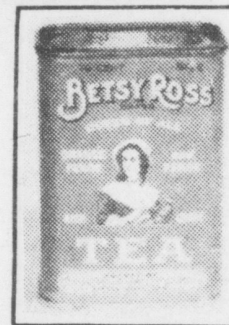
### Mary Sheetz on dean's list
