The storyhour offered by the Mount Joy Library will resume its program on Tuesday, September 14, 1976.

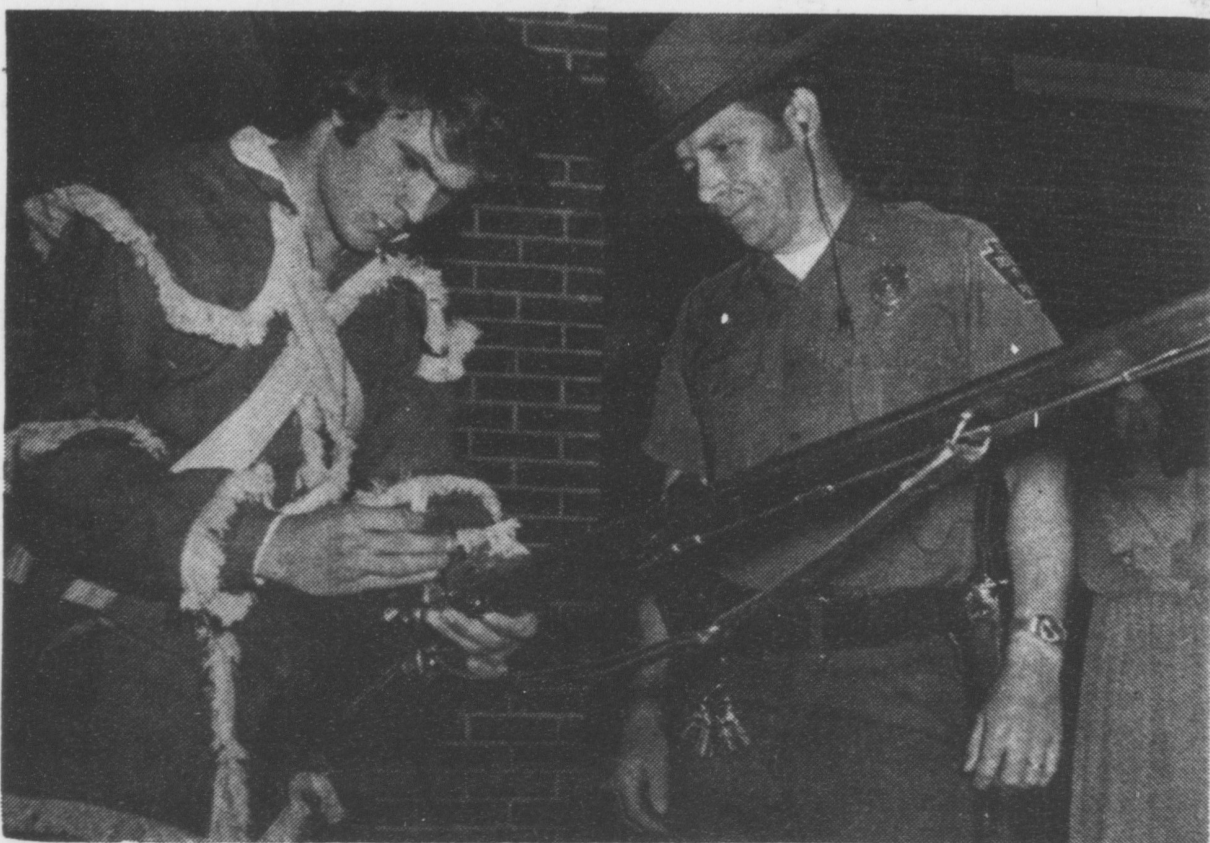
