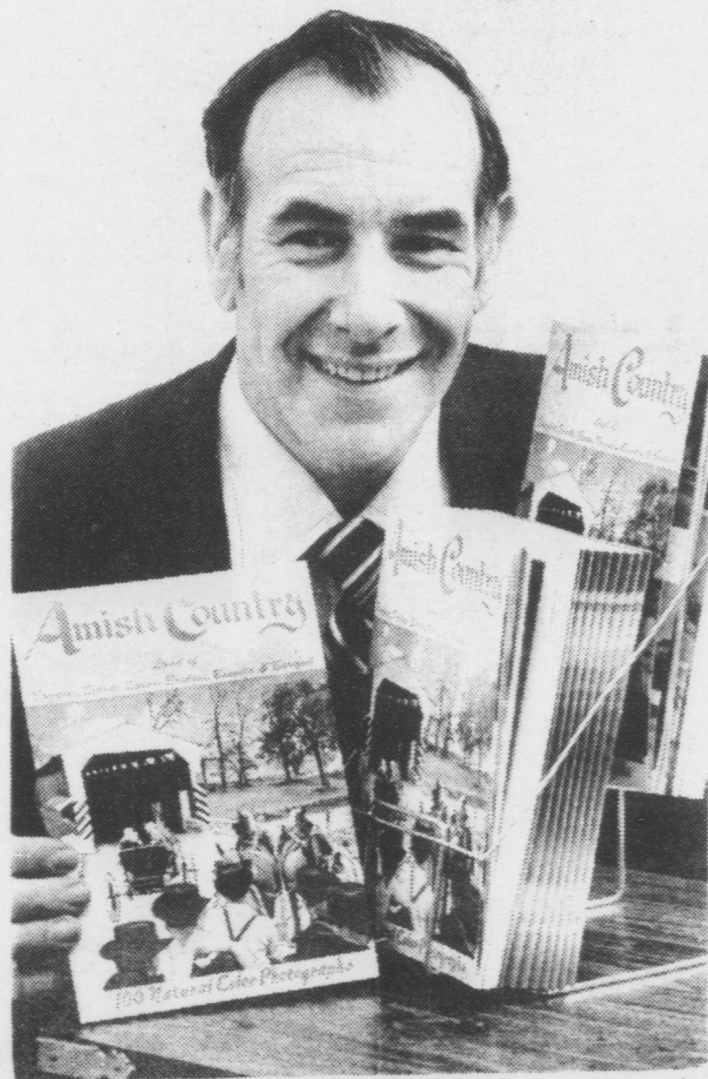

Featured in the book is a two page spread on an amish barn raising complete with a barn burning; an-

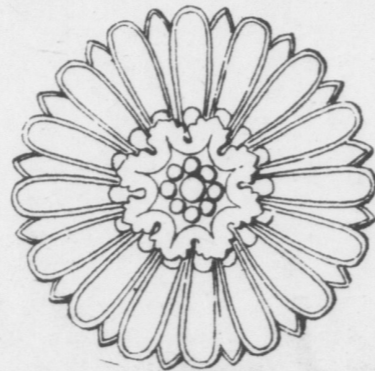
other two page layout on the village of Intercourse, PA and a large selection of covered bridges with Amish buggies, barns and barefeet completing the photographic essay.
