

He works part time at Crider's Service Station in Mount Joy and does farm work.


He is a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church, Mount Joy.

Chris is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard D. Merchant and the grandson of Mr. and Mrs. A. E. McDonald of York, PA.


Jones to head DHS Booster Club
