is only to ensure that your planned changes are in keeping with the outside appearance of your structure. If your changes follow the character of your building, the Board will recommend that Borough Council approve your request. If the changes are not in keeping with the outside structure, the Board will advise you of the changes in plans and specifications which would protect the distinctive character of your property. You will be given time to change your request to meet these suggestions if you wish. If these changes are made, the Board will recommend that Council approve your amended request. If you choose not to make the recommended changes to your request, the Board may advise Council to deny your request for a building permit. In either case, Borough Council gives the final approval or disapproval.

7. What recourse do I have to a Review Board recommendation? Please remember that Borough Council makes the final decision of approval or disapproval of your request for a building permit covering outside changes, demolition, or razing if your property is in the historic district. If it is recommended by the Review Board that your request be altered or disapproved, Borough Council will make the final decision. If Council supports your request, they will grant your building permit and you can proceed with your plans. If, however, Council supports the

Review Board's recommendations to alter or deny your request, you can pursue legal action as is now your right under our borough and zoning laws.
