Memorial Day Service will be held in Maytown on Monday, May 31 starting at 5 p.m.

Chief Marshal will be Norman A. Houseal, Commander, Post 809. Honorary Marshal will be Charles S. Brandt U.S. Navy C.B. W/W II.

The processions will include representatives from Color Guard, Donegal Post 809, Disabled Veterans, Bainbridge Band, Donegal Legion Auxiliary, Ministers, Maytown Bicentennial Comm., Township Supervisors, Boy Scouts, and Columbia Shawnee Band.

Also, Girl Scouts, Maytown Youth Organization, Maytown Jaycees, Church of God Sunday School, Lutheran Sunday School, United Church of Christ, Reich's Evangelical Congregational, Eastern High School Band, Royal Blue Malibu's Baton Corps, and Maytown Fire Company.

There will be ceremonies at the Reformed Cemetery, the Union Cemetery, and Center Square.

A memorial address will be presented by Chester Ray Smith. Colonial Smith's last Army duty was Professor of Military Science at Gettys-

burg College, and director of the Army ROTC programs at York College of PA, Millersville State College, and Mount Saint Mary's College. He retired from the Army last September after more than 34 years of service.

Among his many decorations are two Legion of Merit Medals, the Joint Services Commendation Medal and the Army Commendation Medal.

His many career assignments included: Company Commander in Europe during World War II, and later in Okinawa; Battalion Commander and Commander of the Inchon Water Port in Korea; General Staff Officer with an Armored Division in Germany; and about eight years of duty on the General and Special Staffs of Headquarters, Department of the Army and on a Joint Service Staff.

Colonel Smith is a graduate of Maytown High School and Dickinson College. He also earned his Master's Degree in Business Management while serving with the Army at Michigan State University.

Colonel Smith is the son of Mrs. Herbert Smith of

Maytown, PA. He and his wife, the former Frances Fackler of Florin, PA resides at 2030 Hollywood Parkway, York, PA.

Coincident with Colonel Smith's retirement from the Army was his son's entry into the United States Military Academy. Cadet James Smith is a Plebe (freshman) at West Point. His daughters, Mrs. John Flinchbaugh and Miss Dianne Smith also live in York, PA.

The general committee includes John H. Drace, J. Robert Hollenbaugh, Norman A. Houseal, and Christian Leese.

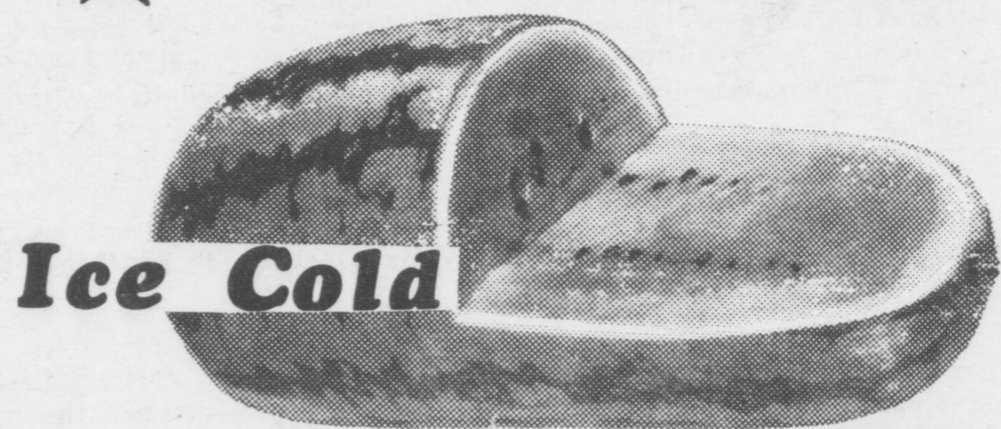

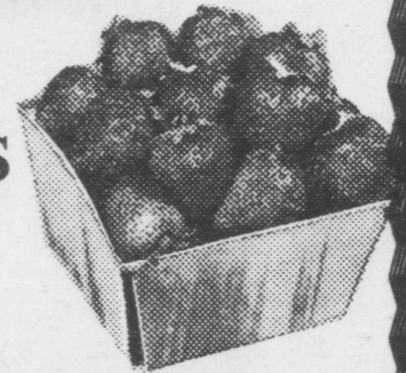
