Memorabilia shown at Union Nat'l Bank

The Union National Mount Joy Bank was chartered as a Banking Institution in 1853 as the Mount Joy Bank. Many changes have been made in these past 123 years--to the name, the building, policies of the bank, and naturally, to the staff. Displays containing memorabilia of these changes are now being shown in the lobby of the Union National Mount Joy Bank and also at the Maytown Office.

These collections of coin, currency, and pictures de-

pic some of the history of the Bank and Mount Joy. Some of the instruments used in early banking operations are on display. Currency was issued by banks and a few of the original printing plates are shown. There are albums of pictures taken of the open house in 1953 and the open houses and dedication of the addition to the original building in 1963.

These displays can be seen daily in both the Mount Joy lobby and the Maytown Office lobby.

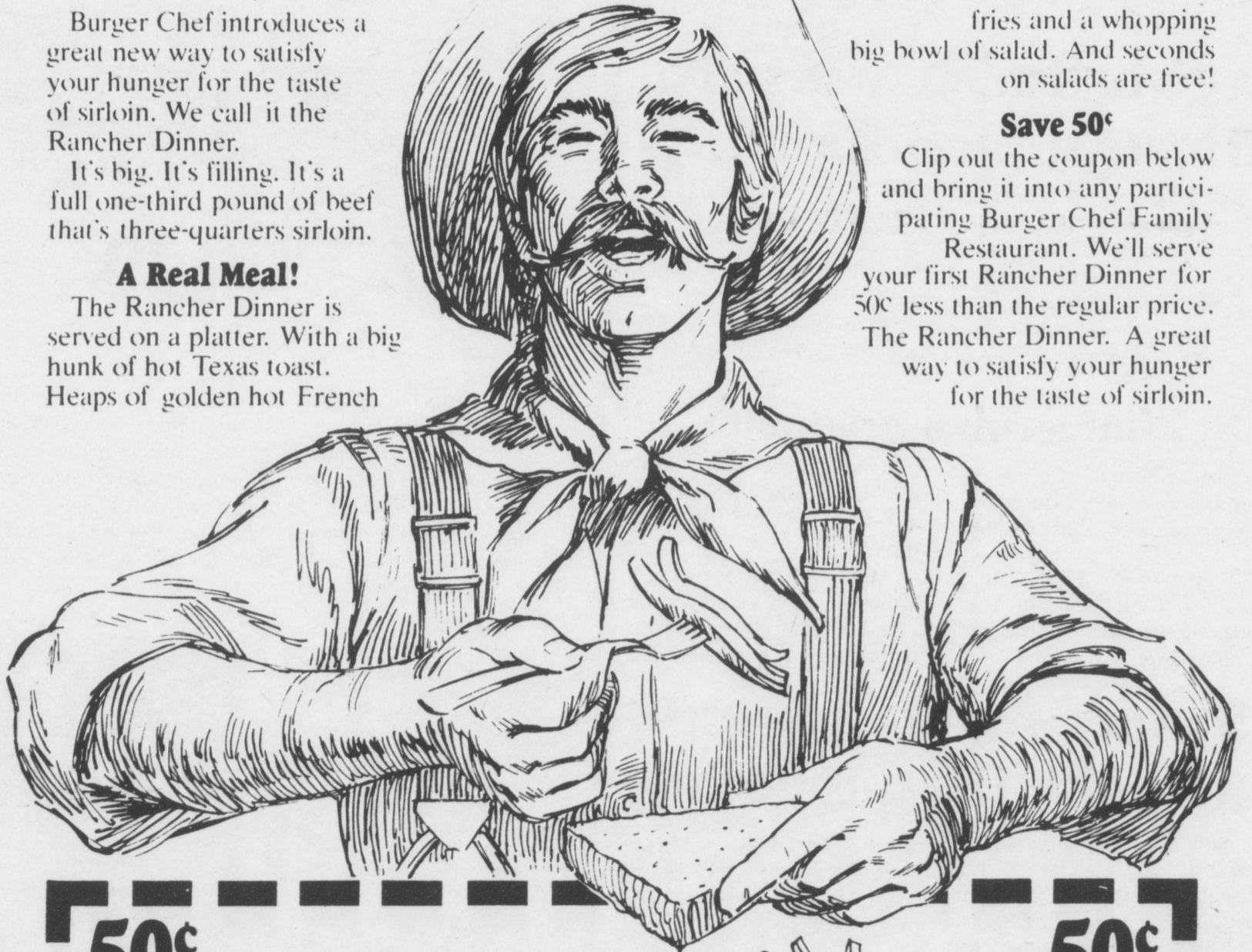

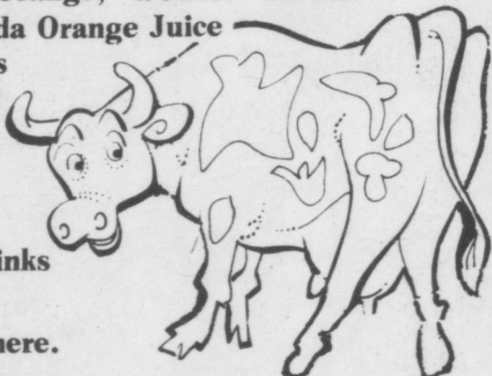
