The presentation of the flag was followed by the Legion and V.F.W. Memorial rites, which included the placing of a wreath on the graves of war dead, a salute to the men who gave their lives, a fire salute and Taps, played by Scott Stauffer.

Supervisors reject sewer plan

At a special meeting on May 25, the Mount Joy Township Supervisors rejected a plan to pay \$74,000 to the Mount Joy Borough Sewer Authority to help expand the treatment plant in the borough.

The money, it was explained, would pay for treatment of up to 60,000 gallons of sewage if a small section of Mount Joy

Township were to hook in to the borough plant.

The supervisors said the money was not available since no provision was made in this year's budget for it.

Several residents of the township objected to the expenditure at this time claiming "there is no guarantee that the service would ever be necessary."

At present there are only 20 homes in the township that could be connected with the borough.
