The Hurst Tool nicknamed the "Jaws of Life" is a portable power rescued tool that operates quietly, flamelessly and does not employ grinding wheels or saw blades. It is a jawlike device with twin forged arms that can pull or lift 5 tons. It can raise a car roof, steering column, dash, or remove doors. Auxiliary adaptors are available for special applications. The tool can be used on fire scenes, in industrial, commercial, auto, and other rescue areas. The Hurst tool is a proven efficient, time saving tool. When put into service, the tool will be available to neighboring fire departments and ambulances during an emergency. The closest "Jaws of Life" is located in Manheim where
