

Zoning board denies special request from New Standard Corp.

The Mount Joy zoning board denied one special exception, but granted four others at its meeting Wednesday night.

The board denied the New Standard Corp's request to raise the roof on its present factory to accommodate a new press.

The New Standard Corp., a metal stamping company was denied the request, the board said, because enough objectionable noise was already produced by the corporation.

The zoning board said, however, if the company would be able to rectify some of the present objections, they could refile their petition and it would be reconsidered.

The New Standard Corp., was commended by the board for its compliance in the complaints against vibrations the plant had produced.

The board granted two exceptions to First Federal Savings and Loans of Lan-

caster.

One exception allowed the First Federal to construct a drive-in window and bank at 24 East Main Street, Mount Joy with the stipulation that traffic would travel north from the drive-in window, and that only right turns would be allowed onto Main Street.

First Federal will be responsible for all signs and street reconstructions, that will be needed.

The savings and loan association was also granted a parking variance, but was told by the board that they must provide maximum parking area for eight cars.

In other action, the board granted permission to Jay Grieder to put three efficiency apartments in an existing building, the Red Rose Dairy Bar.

The board also granted permission for a variance to Loren Rahe, 290 Ziegler Street to build a carport.
