Summer employment supplied by CAP

The Community Action Program of Lancaster County is sponsoring a Rural Youth Summer Employment Project. Youth involved with the Concentrated Employment Training Act (CETA) are available to do such chores as interior and exterior painting, lawn care, window washing, garage and house cleaning including basements and attics.

This program which will be in operation from June 14 to August 13, is strictly a county program providing summer employment for 20 county youths ages 14 to 18. There will be 5 groups of youths working throughout the county. Each group of four youths will be under the supervision of a college student.

The program thus provides employment of 25 youths who are in need of the additional income. Any persons or families on partial or complete assistance, Supplemental Social Income, who carry a green Medical Card, or are physically or mentally handicapped are eligible to receive the services offered by these groups. There is no cost to those people who need such tasks performed.

CAP is hoping to receive painting supplies donated by local businessmen. Any persons who could make such a contribution ought to contact the Lancaster CAP office. This program is beneficial to both the youths employed through CETA and to the people who are in need of the skills offered by the youths. This program was successful last summer, and with the interest and support of the community, the success and continuation of the Project will be guaranteed.

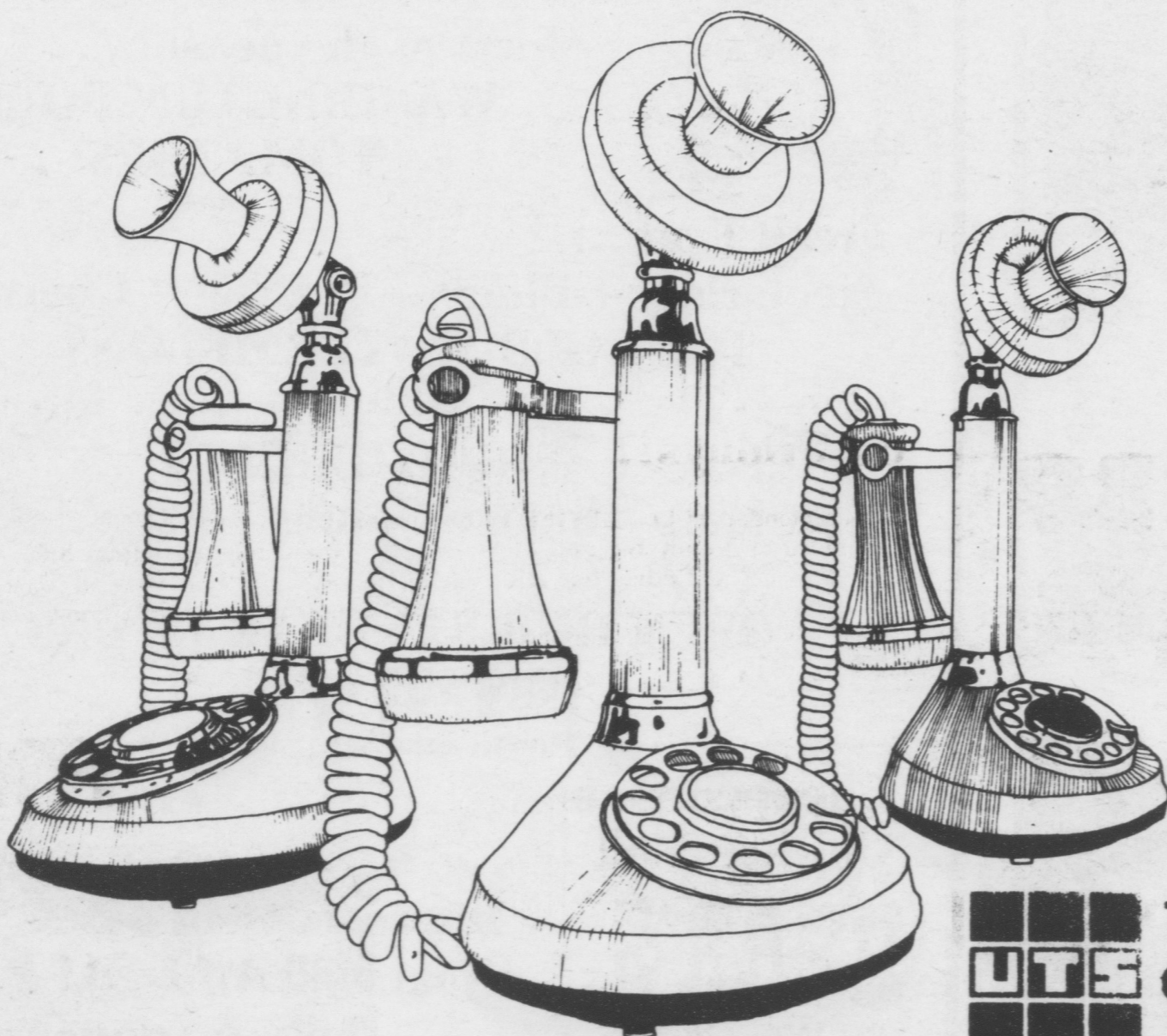
