Marietta-Maytown health center staff expands to 12 physicians

Since the opening of the Marietta-Maytown Family Health Center almost three months ago in the former offices of Dr. Michael Gratch, 23 S. River Street, Maytown, the number of physicians serving there has increased from four to twelve.

The Center is an extension of primary care at St. Joseph Hospital and is

operated by personnel associated with St. Joseph Hospital. It is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 10 AM to 6 PM, and Tuesday and Thursday from 10 AM to 8 PM.

According to Dr. Dale Boyd, director of the Primary Care Department at St. Joseph Hospital, "This is the first step in establishing a permanent primary care practice in the Marietta-Maytown area."

"Primary care is a system of health care delivery that emphasizes continuous care, comprehensive care and quality care. It is the patient's first stop for health maintenance, periodic check-ups, diagnosis, and referral, if necessary."

"I really feel that the hospital-based primary care system is the right one. It means that the Center exists with the sophisticated backup services that the hospital offers."

"St. Joseph is committed to primary care and its importance in a society where the number of specialists is increasing and the number of family practitioners is not growing as rapidly. The use of many hospital administrative and laboratory services, among others, permits us as physicians to concentrate our time on patients."

Medical College; Residency-Medical Center Hospital of Vermont), Dr. Peter Novosel (M.D.-Temple Univ.; Residency-St. Margaret Memorial Hospital, Pittsburgh), Dr. Barry Penchansky (M.D.-Jefferson Medical College; Residency-Lancaster General Hospital), Dr. Alan Peterson (M.D.-Boston Univ.) Residency-Lancaster General Hospital), Dr. Samuel Rice (M.D.-Penn State College of Medicine; Residency-Albany Medical Center Hospital and Medical Center of S. Carolina), Dr. Carol Scatarige (M.D.-Temple Univ. Medical School; Residency-Abington Hospital), and Dr. Herbert Wilsker (M.D.-Univ. of Bologna; Residency-Brookdale Hospital and W. Virginia Univ.
