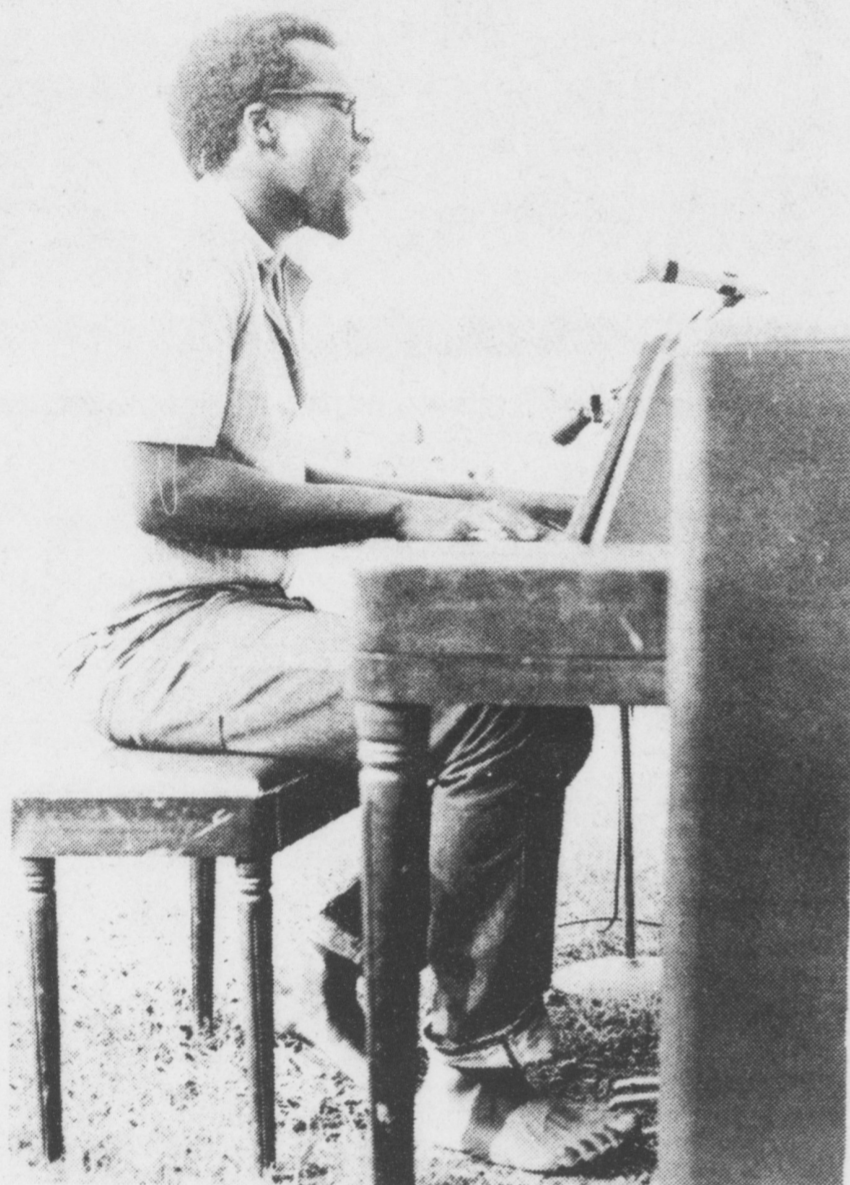




Young spectator tries to figure out how Laura McMillen makes her dummy talk.
