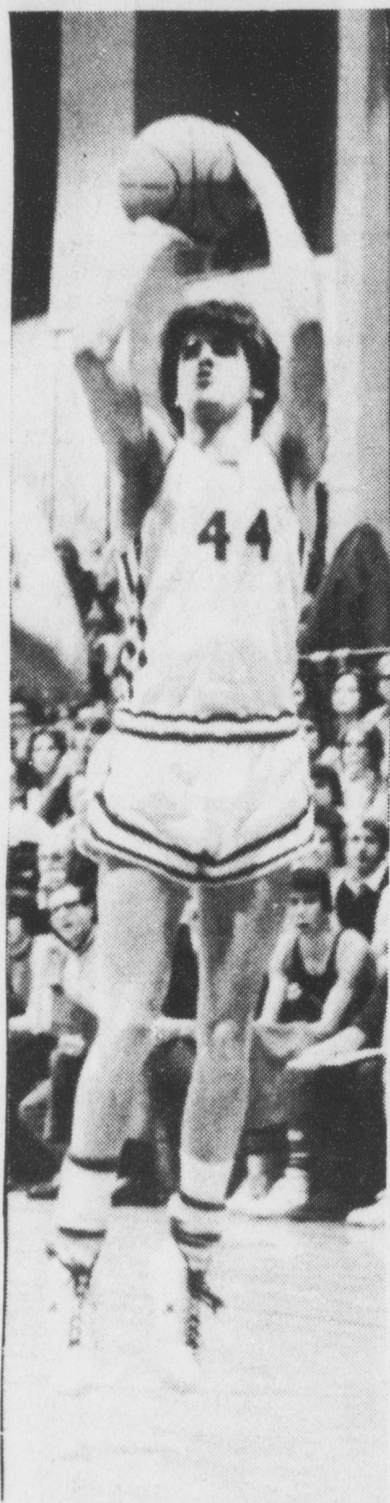


John Fellenbaum will score for Moravian

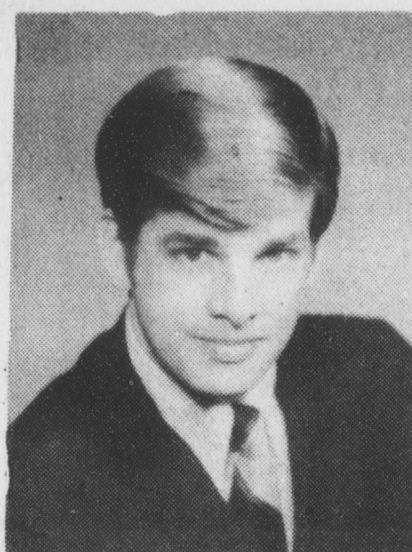

The 6'2" sharpshooter led Coach Emil Swift's Donegal Indians to a Sectional Championship and a 21-4 season—averaging 22.5 points per game. He was co-captain of his team and was selected Donegal's most valuable player, as well as being named to five Lanco-Lebanon County All-Star Teams.

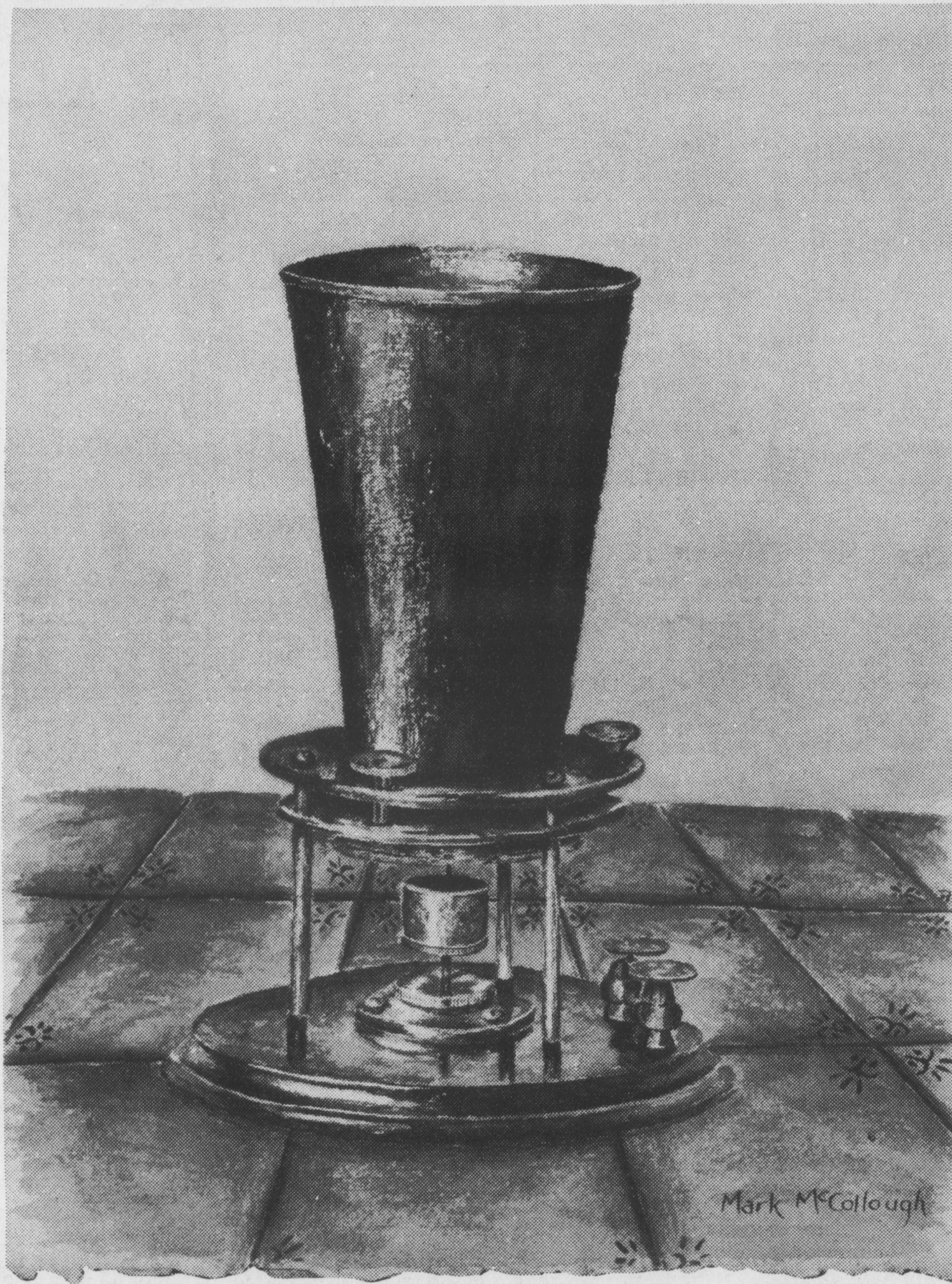
