2,000 feet lower than Mount Everest. He used oxygen tanks to breathe, and free fell for 2 minutes and 10 seconds.

In addition to all this, Joe is also a Master Parachute Rigger, a trade he learned in the Navy (he retired two years ago). There are only three Master Riggers in PA, perhaps 100 in the country. In order to become one, Joe had to be a Senior Rigger, then serve a two year apprenticeship and pass a battery of F.A.A. tests.

Since leaving the Navy, Joe has been practicing his trade at home in Lewisberry, PA. He makes custom parachutes in ten different styles. The size is fitted to the customer's body weight, and colors fitted to his or her taste.

Joe's trade is in profitable flux now. In the last year design advances have halved the bulk and weight of parachutes, and lots of people want the new styles.

Joe is one of the lucky few who have combined their hobby and profession. When he isn't making parachutes, he's using them. Virtually his whole life is parachutes.

Joe told us that his intense involvement in jumping contributed to the breakup of his first marriage, to a woman who had no interest in the sport (his present wife has made 300 jumps). He has also dislocated his arms and broken his legs as a result of bad landings...but he won't stop. "I've been trying to quit jumping for 22 years," he told us, "it's worse than dope."




