
... Marietta Brothers

at the cabin door and offered to nurse Hosea so that his brother Allen could. keep working. Allen agreed. Despite Comstock's nursing, Hosea Grosch died of lockjaw.

Allen wrote to his father, "I feel lonely and miss Hosea— so much that at times I am strongly tempted to abandon everything and leave the country forever, cowardly as such a course would be. But I shall go on. It is my duty. And I cannot bear to give anything up until I bring it to its conclusion. By Hosea's death you fall heir to his spare in the enterprise..."

Allen was completely broke. He went into debt to pay for a coffin and a suit of good clothes for his

brother's funeral. By the time he had paid off his debts, the weather was getting cold. Allen and his assistant Richard Burke decided to cross the Sierra Nevada to California, where they could raise money for a real mining operation.

Comstock, the wild mountain man, staved at the cabin to guard Allen's equipment. In return, Allen gave Comstock a large and generous claim.

In the mountains above Lake Tahoe, a blinding snowstorm overtook the two travels and their donkey. They fought their way through mountainous drifts until they reached Squaw Valley. Walls of soft billowy snow hid the outgoing pass. The men camped in the valley until their provisions ran out. The donkey was dying of hunger.
