Mr. Sperla is married to the former Minnie Kurtz. The couple have one daughter. He is employed as Plant Manager at AMP in Mount Joy.



There are approximately 15-20 girls who are interested in Cadette Girl Scouting. These girls will not have the chance to continue in Girl Scouting because they have no leader.


