15 carries.

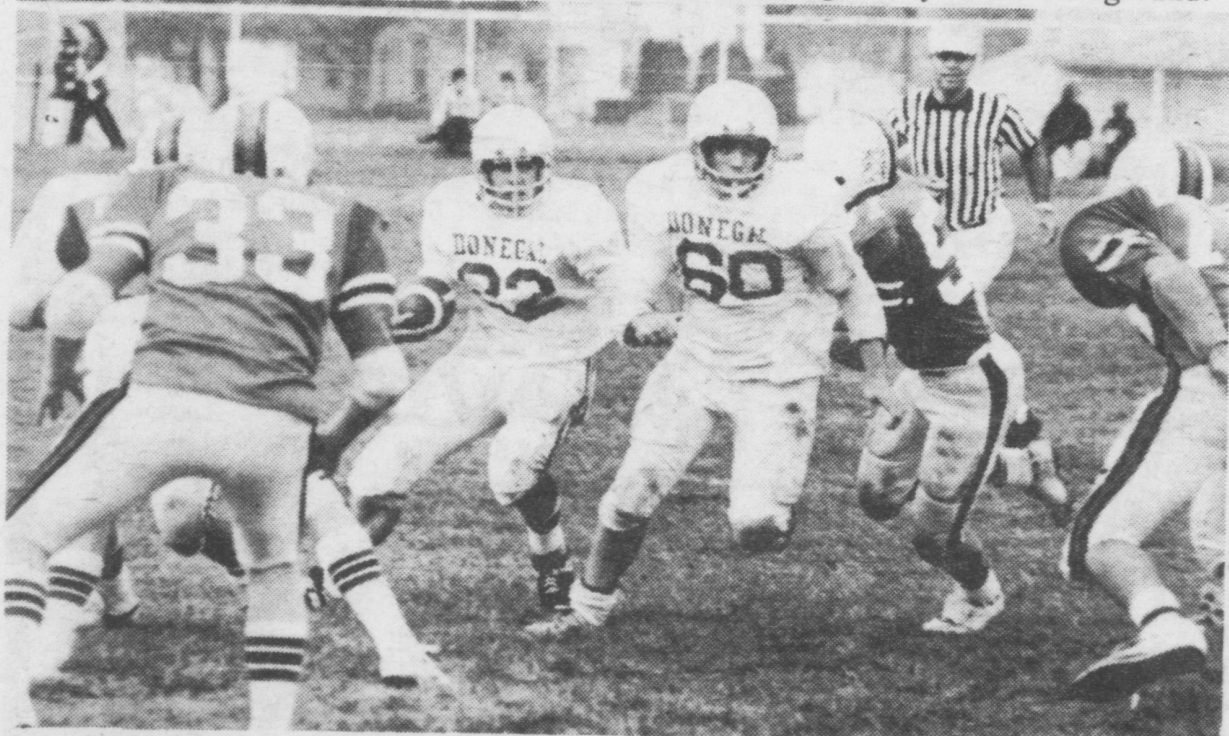
Scott picked up a lot of his yardage on wide sweeps around the line.
