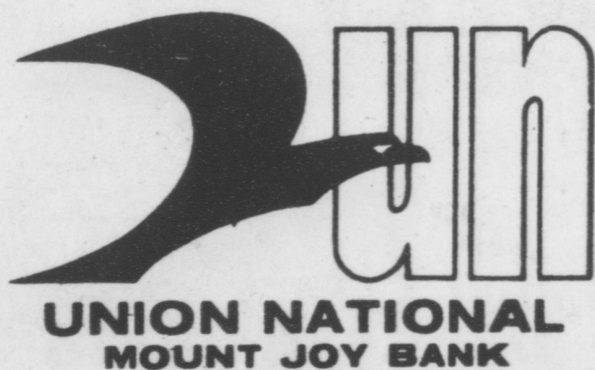

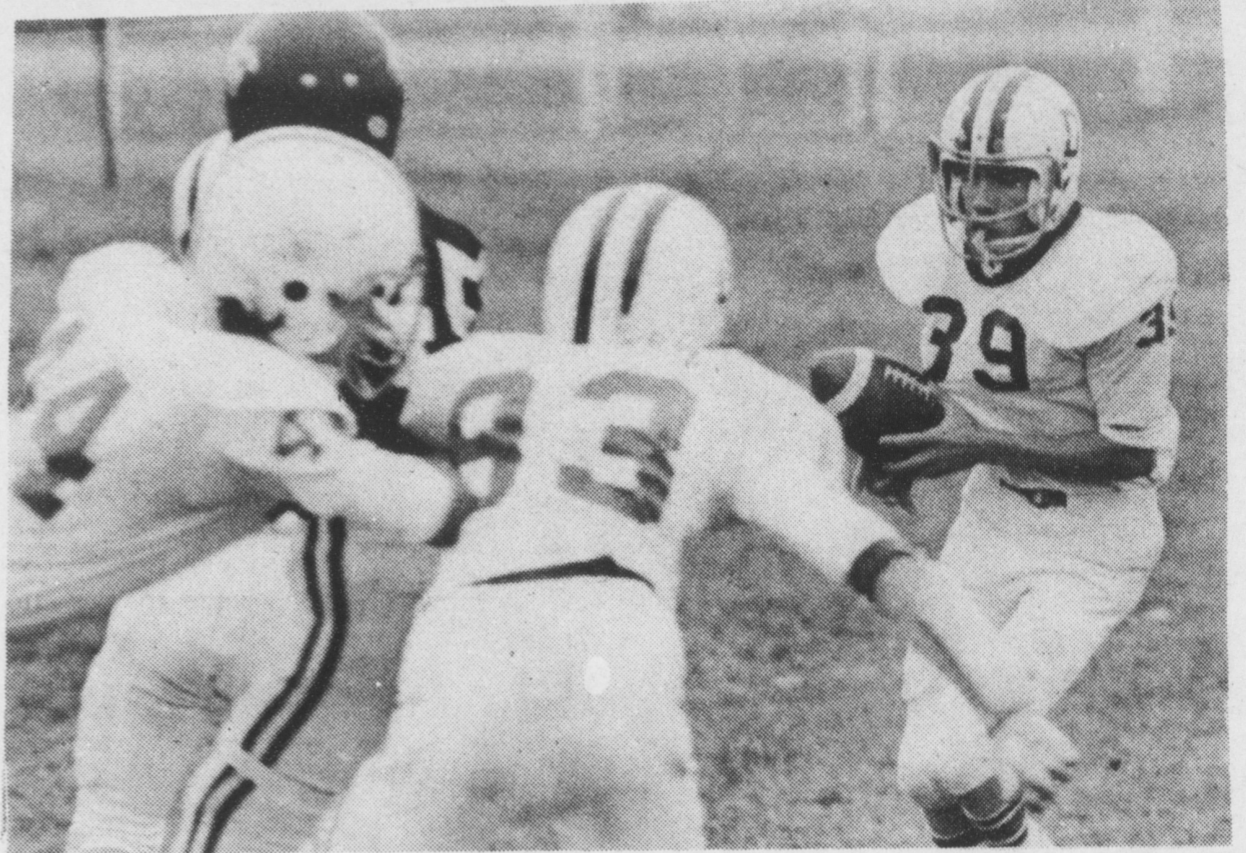


Photo shows the "A" Team in action against Hempfield. From left to right are: Darin Kolp, Jim Perry, and Steve Neal.

Both men retired effective October 1.

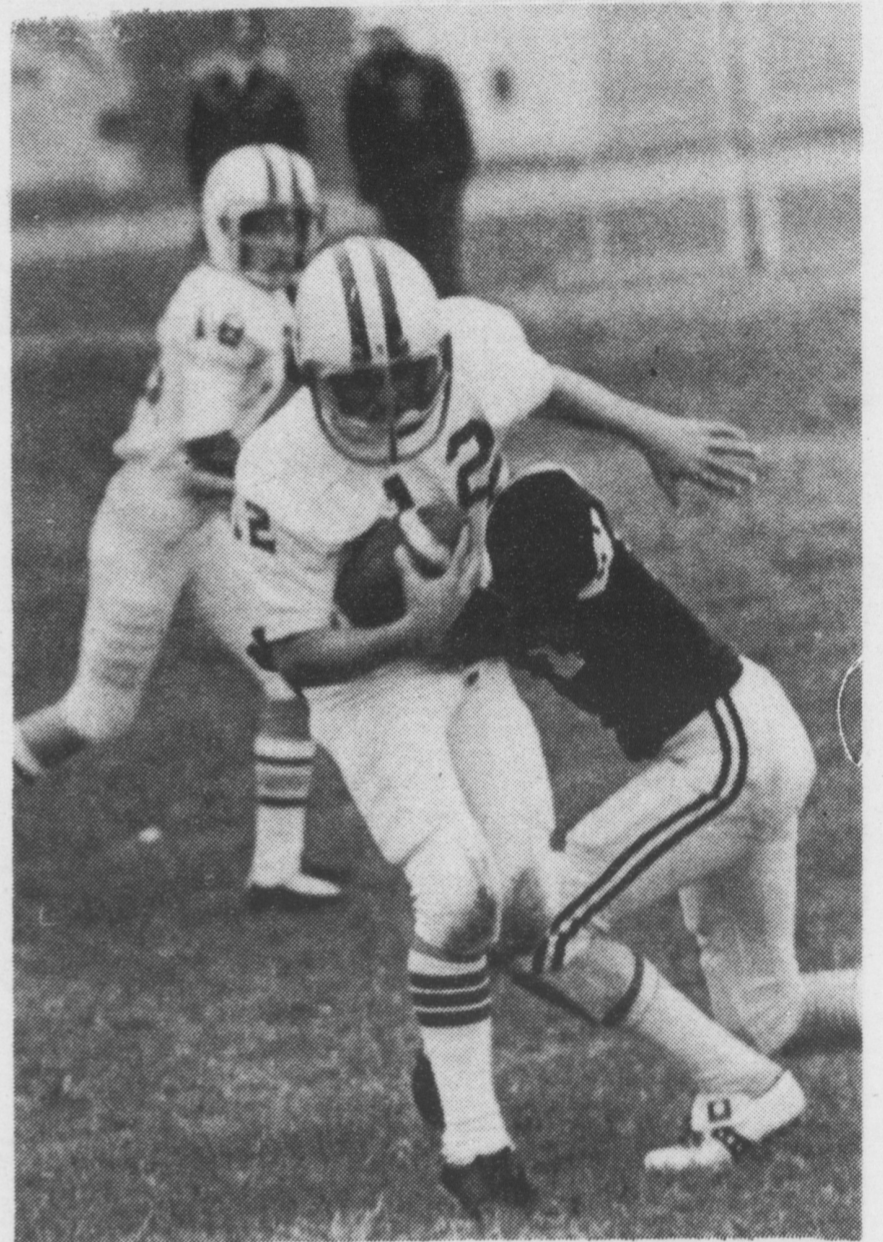


Photo shows Todd Butz of the "A" Team carrying the football against Hempfield. In the background is Scott Buckius.
