## GOP's Ken Brandt seeks another term

Kenneth E. Brandt, Republican from the Falmouth, Conoy Township area, is actively seeking a third term as Representative from the 98th District to the Pennsylvania General Assembly this election. During his four years in office Mr. Brandt has, to his credit, established an impressive rapport with both the rural as well as the urban segments of his district.

He prides himself on his easy accessability and several of his constituents attest to the fact that "he's around when you need him" whether it's a lost birth certificate, a bill collector harrassing a 90 year old widow for delinquent taxes, a welfare check that got lost in the mail, or a complaint that a tree fell down across a state road he gives all the attention that each case requires.
