## Bradley hurls spectacular passes as Indians defeat Vikings 27 - 13

It was Kevin Bradley day at Donegal last Saturday. Donegal's tall quarterback hurled an incredible 292 yards worth of passes as he led the Indians to a 27-13 victory over Norlebcu last week.

Donegal drew the first blood of the afternoon, scoring twice in the first quarter. Bradley hit Gainer with a long pass for the first TD. The second score came on another pass play, this time to Emenheiser.

After that, Norlebcu seemed to be taking over the game for a while. The Vikings scored in the 2d and 3d periods, bringing themselves within a point of the Indians at 14-13.

A bad punt gave the Indians possession of the football on the Viking 35 yard line. Pete Splain put DHS back in control of the game with a 32 yard running rampage.

The Vikings mounted a wild but successful passing attack in the final period. One long Viking bomb after another found its target until Darryl Houseal intercepted the only pass that would have counted on the DHS 5 yard line.

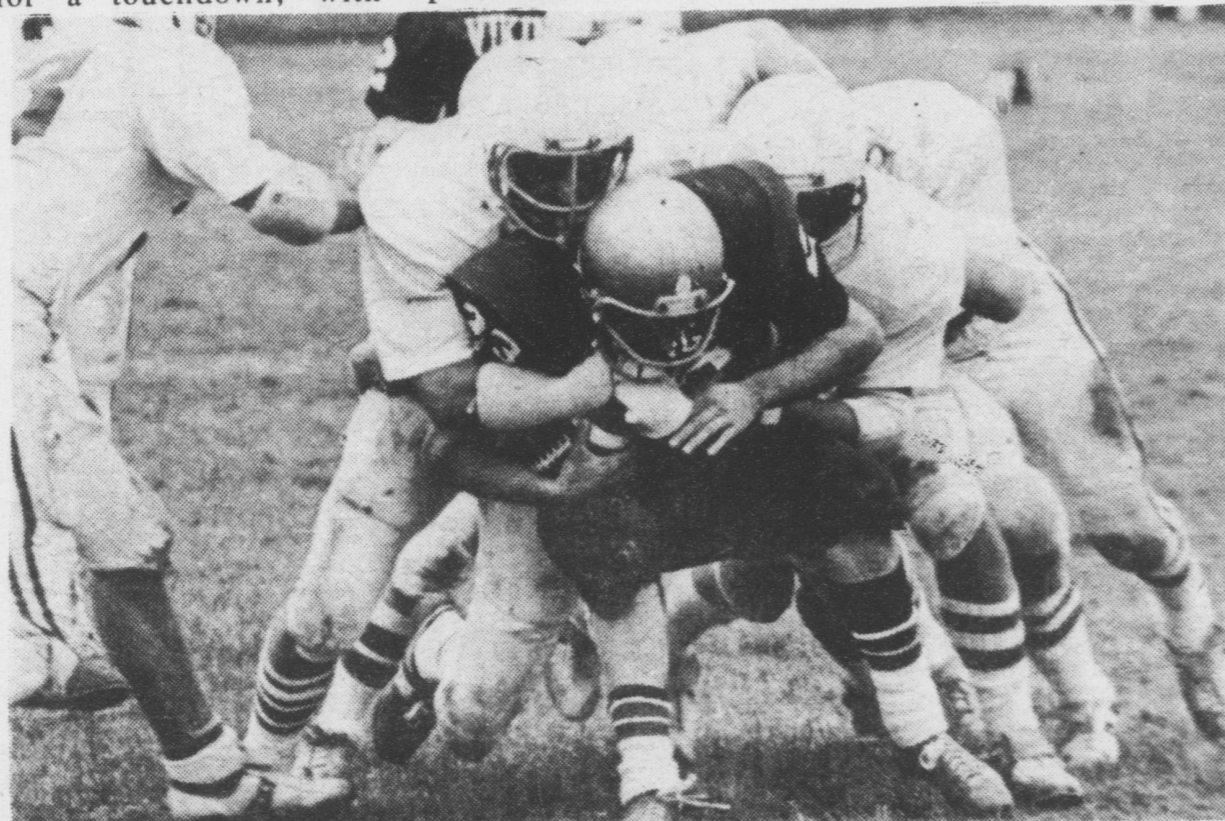
Donegal drove 82 yards for a touchdown, with

Bradley's arm accounting for 56 of those yards. A 30 yard pass to Bill Gainer completed the drive and gave Donegal a decisive lead.

In the game's closing minutes, Darryl Houseal delighted the fans by picking off another Viking pass.
