Frank Zuch, side-car designer, visits his original home—Marietta

Frank Thompson Zuch, a former Marietta resident, has designed an 140 lb. motorcycle sidecar which is practical for small-displacement bikes.

Mr. Zuch lives in Southern California, where his sidecar-manufacturing plant is located. He came to Marietta last week to visit his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry Zuch of 200

East Market Street.

The "Thompson Cycle Car" uses a special mount which simplifies attaching and detaching the sidecar from the motorcycle. According to Mr. Zuch, his sidecar converts a bike into a practical family machine "without compromising the feeling of independence and wind-in-the-face freedom that is what motor-

cycling is all about."
