The club still needs

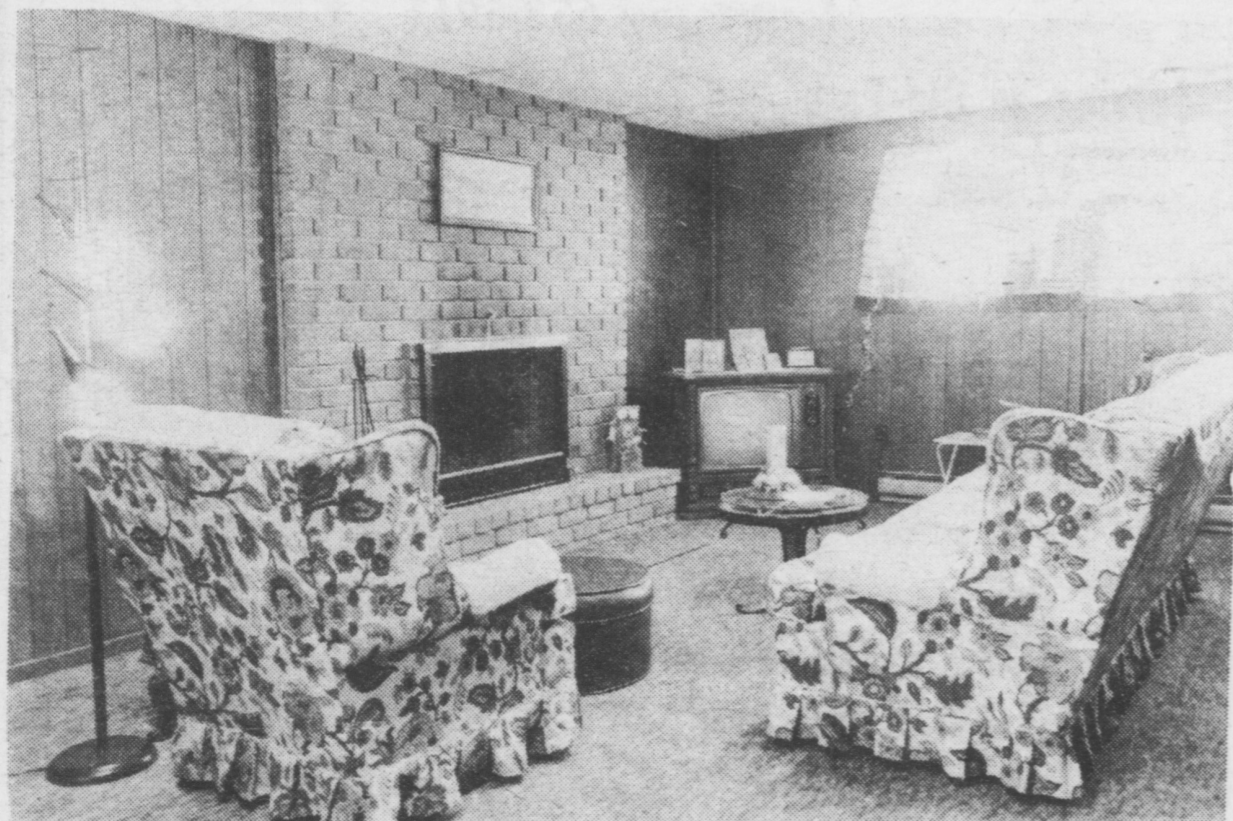
money for electrical equipment and lights for the other playing fields.
