Miss your flu shot?

If you missed getting your swine flu shot at Riverview, you can be vaccinated free at the following locations;
Weds. (today) at E-town Sr. High, 600 W. High St., between 2 and 7 p.m., (Call 367-1521 ext. 129 for information)
Thurs. (Nov. 18) at Hempfield Sr. High, Landisville, from 2-7 p.m. (898-2231)

Anyone over 18 who did not get a swine flu shot already is eligible. Flu season starts in December, and the vaccine takes 3 weeks to take effect.

People who are coming down with a fever should not get the shot. The reason; if the fever happens to be swine flu, a vaccination will only make it worse.

The swine flu serum was administered with a gun that shoots a stream of liquid. The serum leaves

the gun under such high pressure that it penetrates human skin to a depth of 1/4 to 1/2 inch. No needle is necessary, and the shot

is almost painless.

Adele Marsteller, of Manheim, who ran the program, noted that the turnout was big and that the worst reaction anyone had suffered was a sore arm.

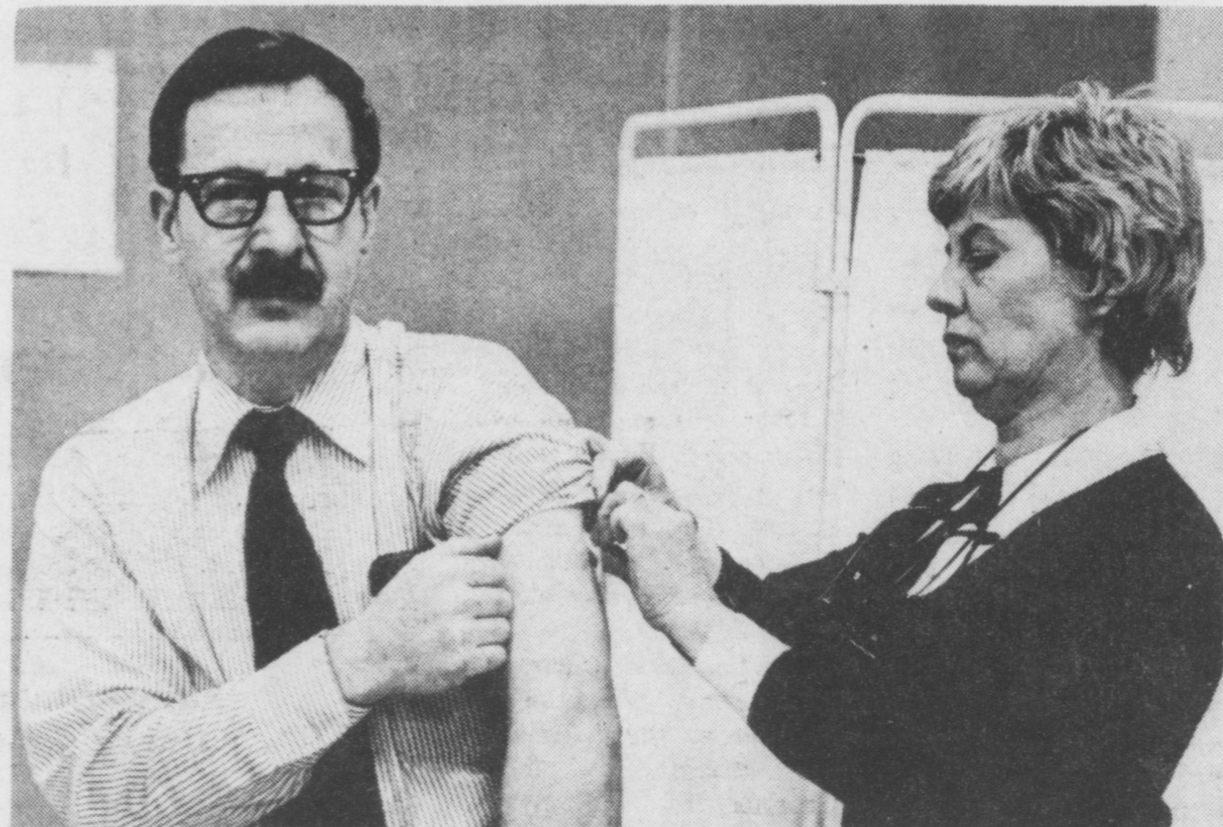
