Sen. Ralph W. Hess, R-28, reminds all retirees with an income under $\$ 7,500$ a year that they are eligible to get license plates for their car for a $\$ 10$ processing fee.
"It means a considerable saving now that license plates cost \$24,' Hess said. "I certainly hope everyone who is eligible takes advantage of this reduced fee.'
Hess said applications for the $\$ 10$ registration fee can be obtained at this office, Box 216, Spring Grove, Pa 17362.
Hess noted the special fee is just one of many programs the Legislature has enacted on behalf of the Commonwealth's senoir citizens.

The application, which is about the size of a postcard, requires the title number, serial number and registration number of the retiree's vehicle and the individual's signature. If the vehicle is jointly owned, as is often the case with a married couple, both must sign the applications. If the vehicle is jointly owned, then the combined income of the two people cannot be more than $\$ 7,500$

## a year.

The application must be returned with the regular vehicle registration form that every vehicle owner receives in the mail and a chech for $\$ 10$ payable to PennDOT.
