Saturday morning, going through the almost 200 completed Merit Badge applications from the Provisional Troop, I found one for the Swimming Merit Badge for this Scout and I felt good, all over, for this one single completed Merit Badge meant as much to this Scout as for some of the others in the troop who completed four or five Merit Badges.
