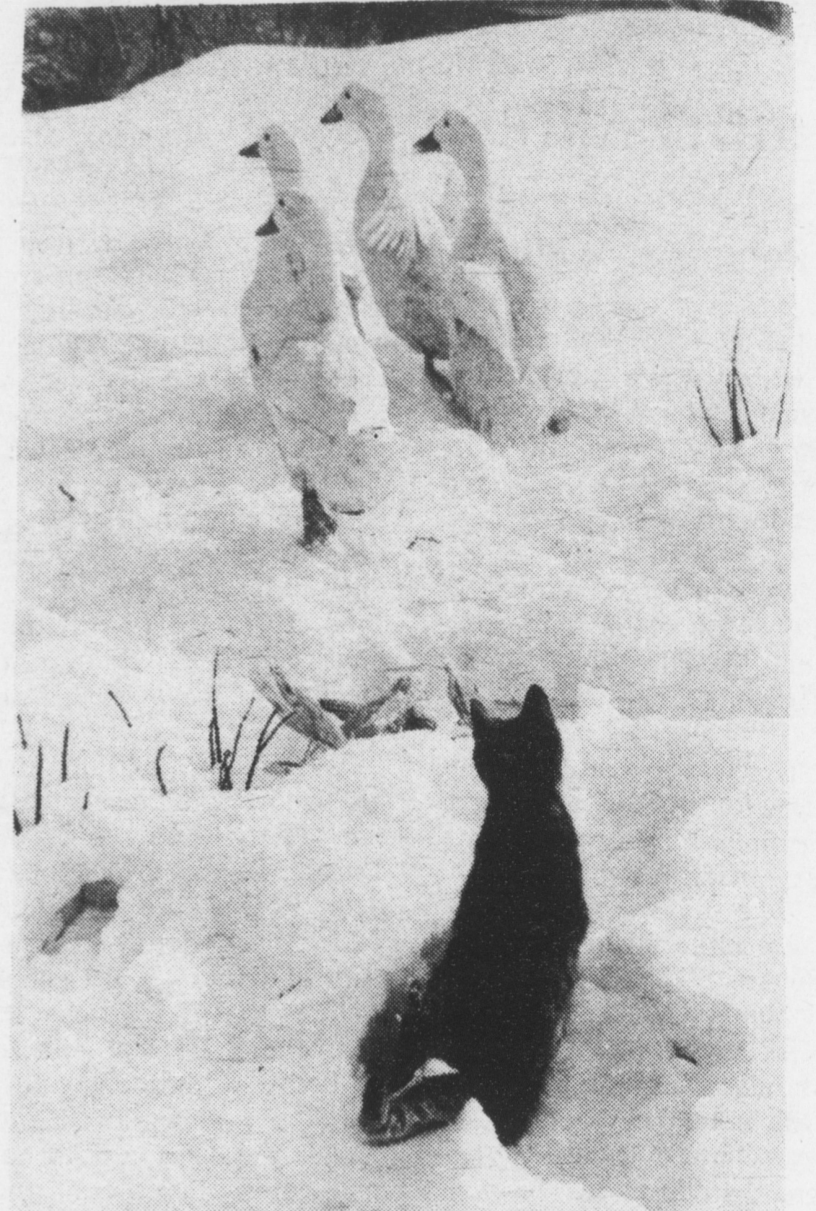
BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted as follows:

**Section 1.** The tax collector shall receive for the collection of Borough taxes from and after January 1, 1978 a commission of one (1) per centum of the amount of Borough taxes collected by the tax collector.

**Section 2.** The tax collector shall on or before the tenth (10) day of each month pay over to the Borough all monies collected as taxes during the previous month, except that during the period of April 1 to June 1, inclusive, the tax collector shall pay over weekly to the Borough all monies collected as taxes for the previous week. All payments of tax monies shall be accompanied by a report of the taxes collected; this report shall include the names of the taxables, the amounts collected from each, along with discounts granted or penalties applied, if any, and the total amount of taxes received, discounts granted and penalties applied to date. The Borough Council, at its option, may prescribe the form of the tax collector's report.

**Section 3.** All ordinances and parts of ordinances or resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
