There were big pictures outside the restaurant. One showed a hefty man. The picture was captioned "I eat here." The other showed a skinny man whose caption was, "I don't."

Tuffie's son, T.W. Olena, Jr., showed us a

menu from his father's restaurant. Shifters were not listed on the menu (they hadn't been invented yet), but ham sandwiches sold for 5 cents each. The menu dates from around 1914.

A 1942 menu shows the effect of inflation. A ham sandwich cost 10 cents. Shifters appear on the 1942 menu. The price: 10 cents.
