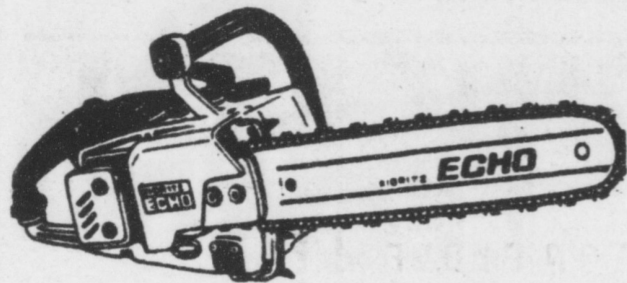
**PWP to meet**

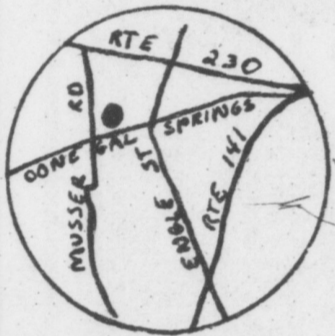
