Forty handsome exhibit panels tell the story of blacks during this period by presenting their portraits and deeds in pictures and words--as soldier and sailor, founder of the black church, fighter for equality, organizer of school, lodge, and society; as scientist, writer poet, artist, captain, physician, frontiersman, and rebel.
