No shortage of oil or electricity here

The current natural-gas and fuel oil shortages have not yet affected local electric companies and oil suppliers.

"PP&L at this time has adequate capacity to supply electrical customers in its service ares," PP&L executive vice-president Brooke R. Hartman said.

He added, however, the the Company recognizes the problems occuring as a result of fuel shortages in other areas, and it is endoring compliance with the requests of Governor Shapp and President Carter for conservation measures.

PP&L is watching for the possible effect on electrical

loads of a switchover to electric space heaters due to shortages of other fuels. Hartman pointed out that PP&L has been endorsing energy conservation since the early 1970's and believes that energy conservation must be an ongoing way of life. "Conservation must continue untill such time as the nation formulates a long-term energy policy which can adequately deal with the increasing demand for all forms of energy to preserve our economic health as a nation," he concluded.

Several local fuel oil suppliers told this newspaper that they anticipate no shortages.
