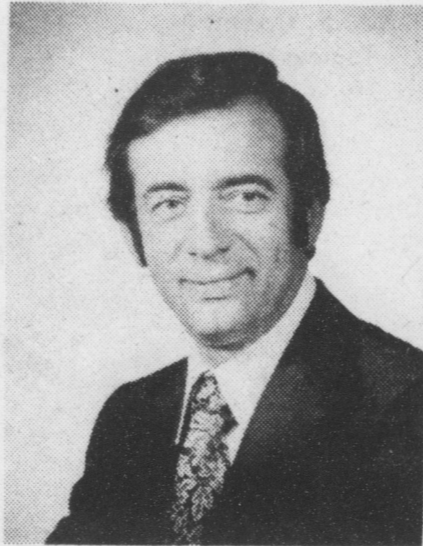

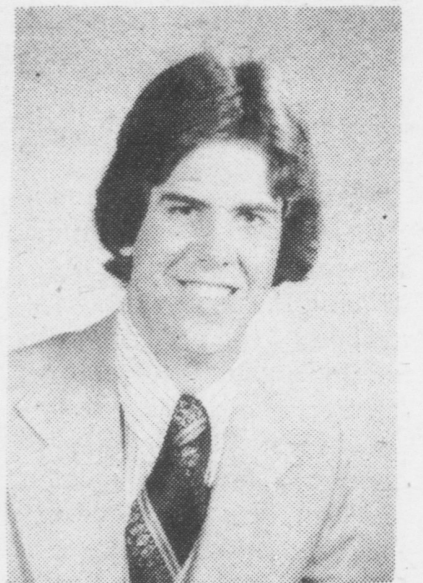
He, and his wife, Alice,

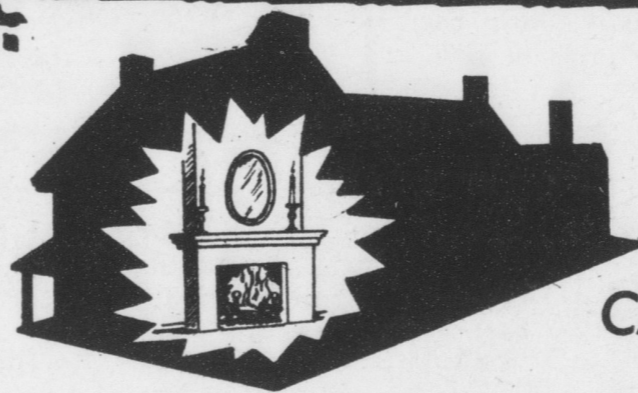
She is a senior in the Academic course at Donegal High School. Her high school activities include:

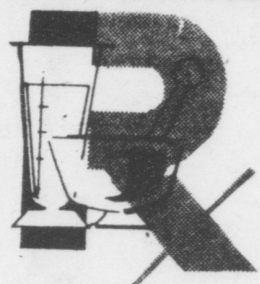
