Rev. Klepper and his wife, the former Barbara Shilling, have four children: Kathryn, 10; David,

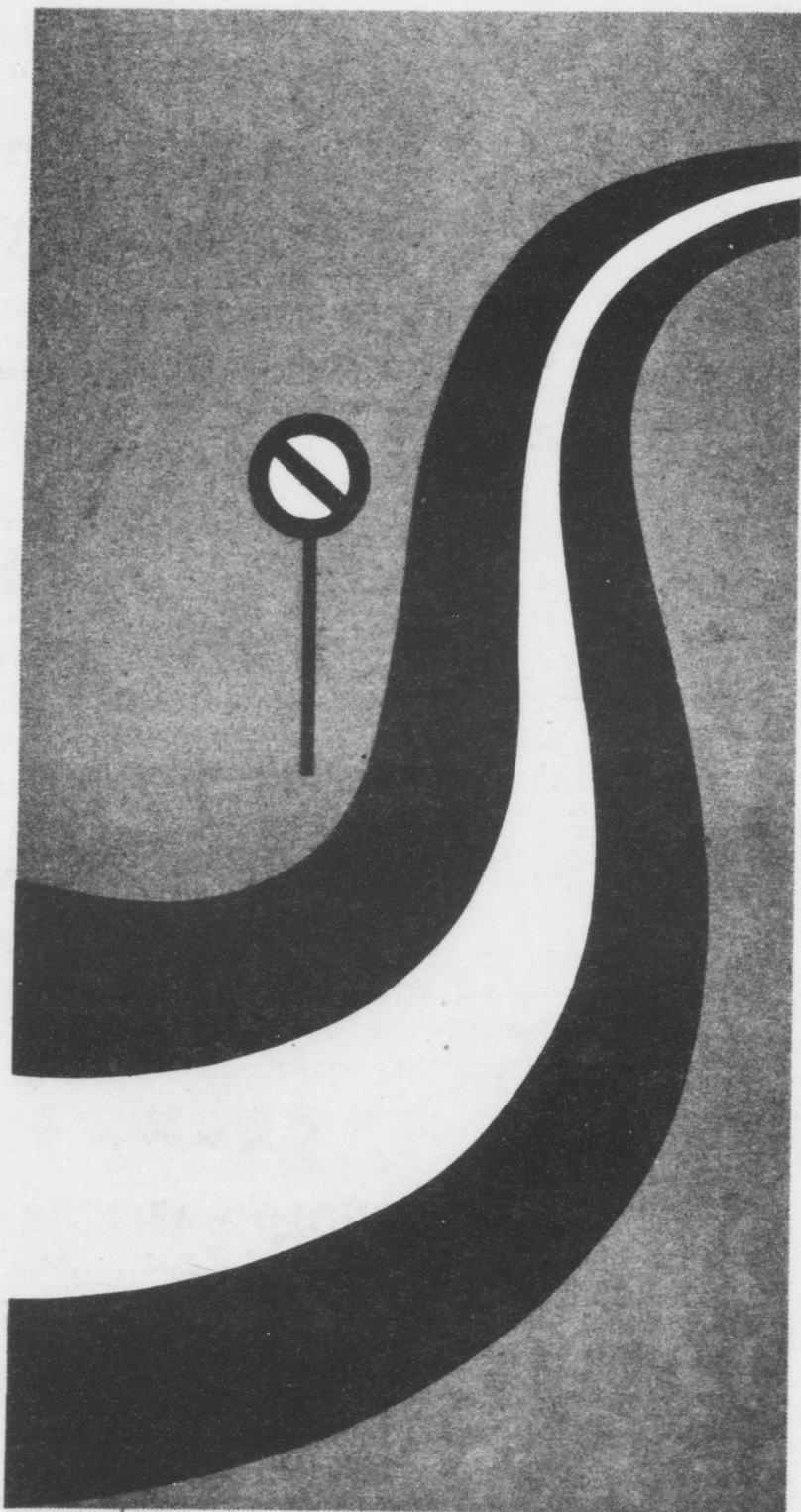
11; Julia, 12; and Susan, 14.
