PUBLIC NOTICE ORDINANCE NO. 389

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MOUNT JOY BOROUGH ZONING ORDIN-ANCE OF 1975 BY MAKING CHANGES TO SECTION 502.e CONCERNING THE AREA AND BULK REQUIREMENTS AND SECTION 502.f CONCERNING THE MINIMUM SETBACK REQUIREMENTS FOR A MEDIUM DENSITY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1. Section 502.e of the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1975 concerning the area and bulk requirements in a medium density residential district is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 502.e--Area and Bulk

	Single Family Detached	A Single Family Semi-Detached Dwelling Unit	PRD
Minimum lot size Minimum lot width at	9,680 sq. ft.	4,840 sq. ft.	
setback Maximum density	80 ft. 4.5 units/acre	35 ft. 9 units/acre	9 units/acre

Section 2. Section 502.f of the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1975 concerning minimum setback requirement for a medium density residential district is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 502.f--Minimum Setback

Front: 30 feet; however, no building exclusive of open porches and overhanding eaves and cornices, shall extend nearer to a front lot line the mean distance of setback of the nearest building or buildings, other than accessory buildings, within 100 feet on each side of said building and fronting on the same side of the same street, except that in no instance shall a building be placed nearer to a front street than 25 feet nor required by the above to be setback more than 50 feet. Where 100 feet, the building setback shall be as specified for this district. Side: 15 feet; provided, however, that for semi-detached dwellings only one sideyard will be required; Rear: 20 feet. Accessory setback: 30 feet from front line, 5 feet from side and rear lot lines.

Section 3. All other parts, sections, subsections and provisions of the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1975 shall remain in effect as heretofore adopted. Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.


