Michael Rider completes Marine assault course

Marine Private Michael J. Rider, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. William Rider of Route 1, Mount Joy, Pa., has completed the Basic Assault Amphibian Crewman's Course.

The seven-week skill training at the Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, N.C., was designed to prepare him for assignment to a Marine assault amphibian unit. Assault amphibian vehicles are used to transport troops and supplies both from ship to

beachhead and during subsequent operations ashore.

He received instructions on the vehicle's capabilities and operating characteristics; participated in land and water driving exercises; and studied operator-level maintenance procedures.

He is currently serving with the 2d Assault Amphibian Battalion at Camp Lejeune.

A 1976 graduate of Donegal Senior High School, he joined the Marine Corps in August 1976.

Sue Phillips breaks swimming record

Susan Phillips, daughter of Roger and Audrey (nee Appley) Phillips, Birdsboro, and granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar N. Appley, Marietta, set a new record in the 12 and under 50 yard breaststroke of 36.1. She was part of the medley relay team who also set a new record (2:12.2) in the Penn-Del Championship on March 5th. She has been swimming with the Pottstown YMCA team for the last three years.

Sue then went on to the Eastern District Championship meet at Mercersburg Academy on March 19th. The team finished 4th with a time of 2:12.1, and Sue finished 9th in the breaststroke in 36.798, which qualified her to swim in both events at the State YMCA Championship to be held in York on April 1st.
