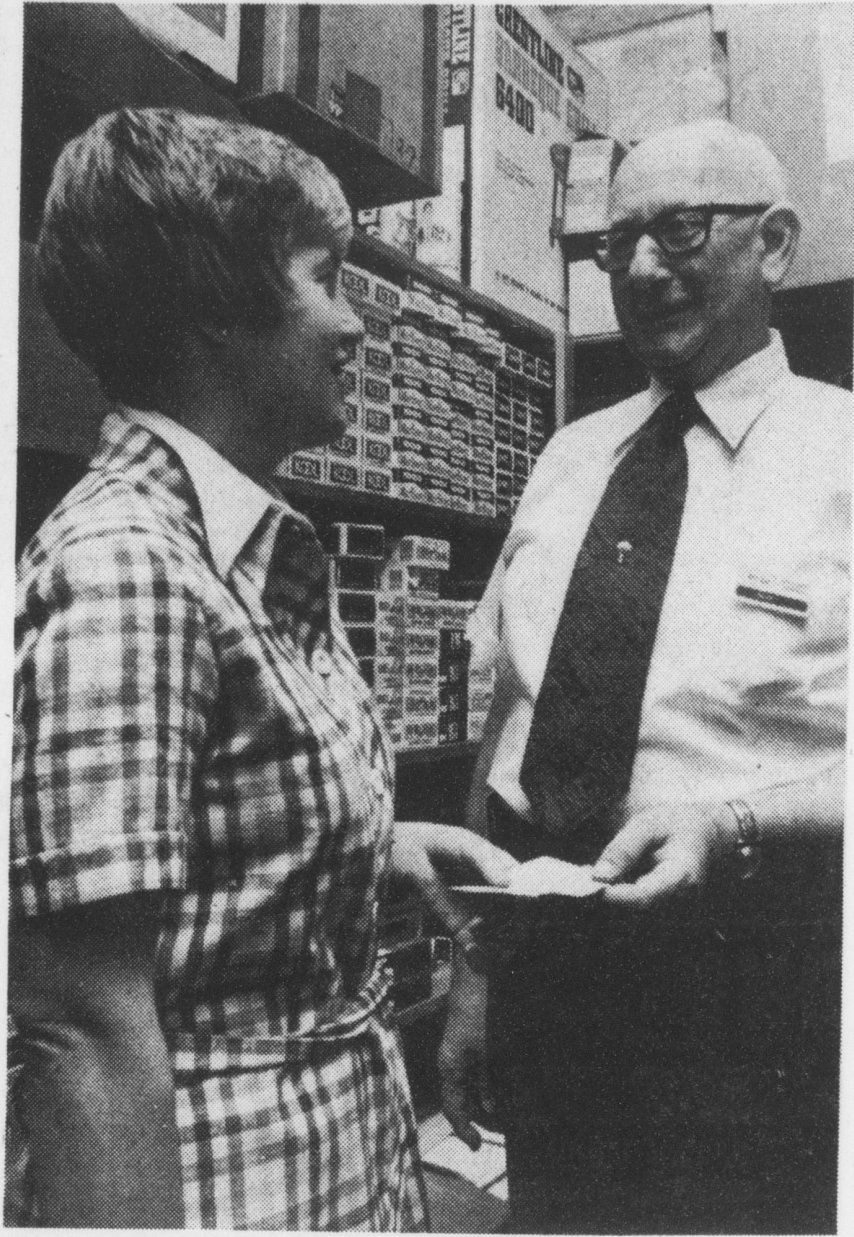

Mount Joy Council agenda

The proposed agenda for the Mount Joy Borough Council meeting to be held on Monday, April 11, 1977 at 7:30 p.m., in the Borough Offices Building, 21 East Main Street, Mount Joy, is as follows:

1. Receive and discuss the final subdivision plan for Parkside Homes on Le-fever Road.
2. Receive and consider awarding bids for the Donegal Springs Road curbing project.
3. Hold the second reading and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 389 amending the existing Zoning Ordinance.
4. Discuss the request of the Merchants Association to have the Borough operate the snow removal procedure for Main Street.

Sewers

Mount Joy Township Sewer Authority members were told by the engineers that PenDOT rejected the authority's plan to hang a force main line under the parapet of the Route 283 by-pass bridge on the Mount Gretna Road.

PenDOT suggested the township authority go underground with the line. According to the engineers the suggestion by PenDOT could possibly double the original estimated cost.

The authority said they will conduct further study on the force main sewer line/bridge issue and hopefully convince PenDOT to accept the original plan.

In other business the Authority's engineers asked for and received approval for test core borings at the proposed sites for the three pumping stations.

Core test borings entail drilling holes to the depth of the sewer pumping station, approximately 16 feet. The tests will reveal the type of rock and soil at the site and thereby determine the type and method of construction.

A letter of request, to the West Donegal Authority, for 50,000 gallons, 80,000 gallons per day, over a twenty year period, was approved by the authority. The capacity for sewer service request was not changed from the original request to West Donegal Township Authority two year ago.

The Mount Joy Township Zoning Hearing Board heard further evidence on a request for a variance at
