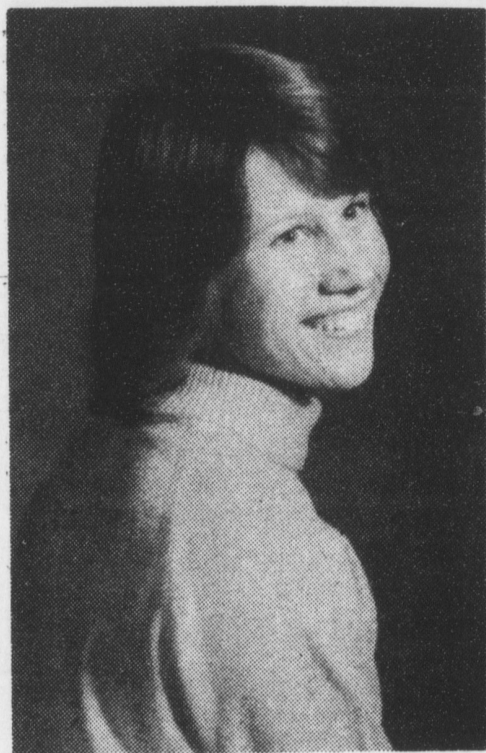
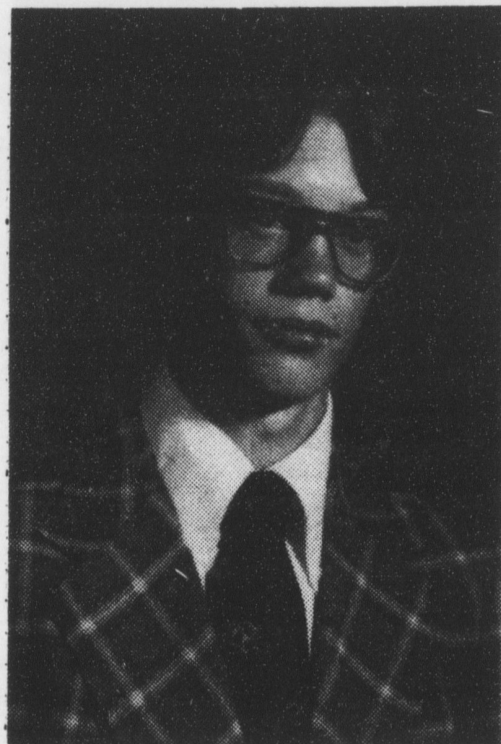


Loris Raber and Greg Lindemuth are boy and girl of month
