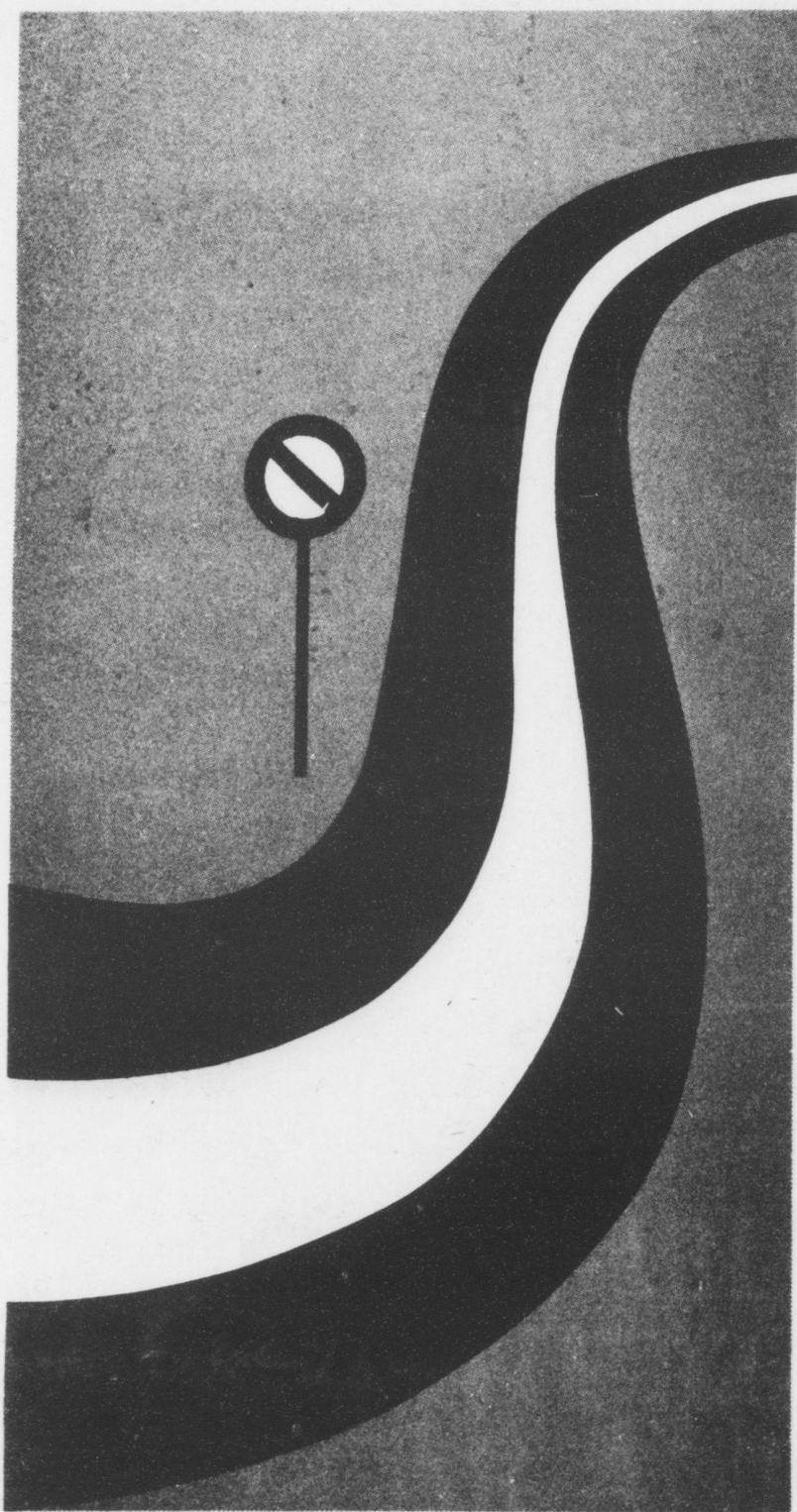
Votes at 1c each may be put in canisters placed in

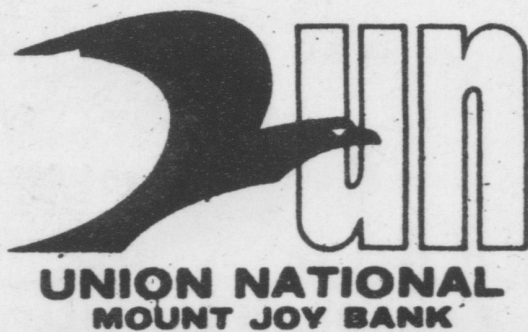
