

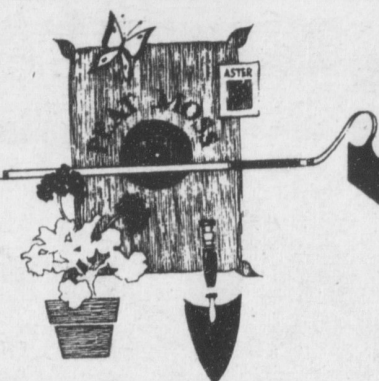
Coaches donate \$800 for lights

2000 newcomers in Maytown?

Work will begin soon on the first phase of a planned 500-unit housing development near Maytown. If the project lives up to expectations, it could double Maytown's population.

HUD, the FHA and the

VA are about to give final approval for "phase one" of the development, builder William Endslo says. He hopes construction will be in full swing within three months.

The project has been in the planning stage for 5

years, but details like sewer lines have only recently neared completion.

Ten years from now, the completed development could house 2000 people on 77 acres of land. The current population of Maytown is about 1500.
