Old films to be shown at Hobby and Craft Show



Mount Joy.


Some exhibitor space is available and may be reserved by calling Mrs. Warren Heisey or Mrs. William Barto.

Roses of this high quality (ordinarily not doubled) take up to ten years and cost thousands of dollars to develop. Once bred, the strains are patented.
