

East Donegal Supervisors award contracts for stone, asphalt, and buy truck

East Donegal Township Supervisors awarded contracts for road oil asphalt to McMinn's Inc. of Lancaster at 40c per gallon; Klines Quarry, stone at \$12.40 per ton totaling \$1,540; Harrisburg Asphalt, Inc., for asphalt at \$12.40 per ton; and purchased a '75 Chevy dump truck from Reed's

Chevrolet for \$19,135.57.

Fifteen permits totaling \$528 were issued for alterations and new structures.

Phares Heisey, president of the Bainbridge-Maytown Rotary club, was present and said his club would contribute \$380 to the tree fund. Names of

tree donors will be placed in a weather proof three sided revolving case, erected on a concrete or brick base, which will be installed on the park grounds. Chet Flowers, chairman of the Park Commission said another tree planting program will begin in the fall.

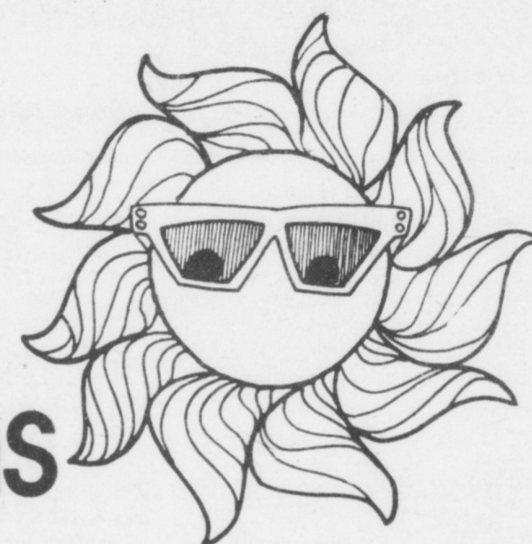

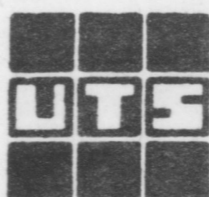
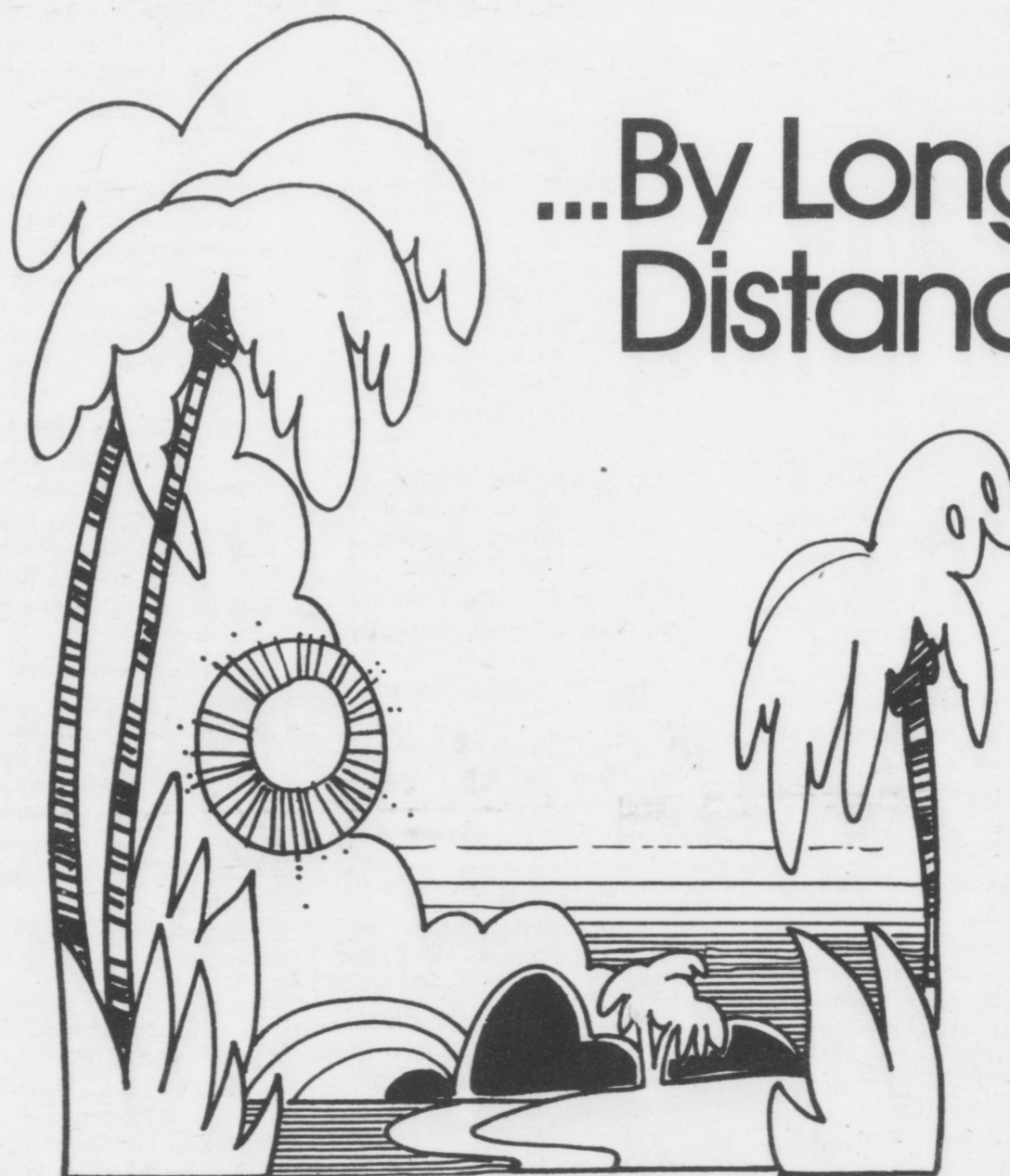
