

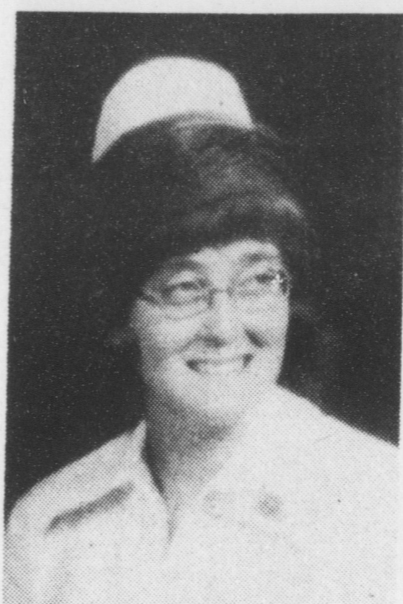

CPR course Marietta Ambulance crewmen certified


